Former Chicago Vice Queen Dies

CHICAGO, Nov. 15.—(AP)—Vic Shaw, 89, a powerful queen of Chicago vice during the gaslight era, died Saturday in a dingy old South Side mansion she once had presided over as a plucky and famous brothel.

In recounting the story of her life to a reporter two years ago, she said she ran away from home in Nova Scotia when she was 13.

Friends had attempted to keep her death a secret and did until it was registered Monday under her legal name of Mrs. Emma Ludwig.

As a young woman, Vic took a firm and lasting control of vice in Chicago. She bought a brownstone mansion in the early 1900's which became the headquarters of all of her operations.

She listed many old-time powerful political figures among her friends. She said she first knew Al Capone as a young hoodlum whose first job was to warn madames of impending police raids.

In her heyday, Vic ran a prosperous narcotics and hijacking business along with prostitution, but when her empire began to collapse, Vic, too, fell into the ruins.

She began using narcotics herself, and finally, in 1942, was sentenced to five years imprisonment. She served less than two years and returned to live the rest of her life in the old mansion, which she converted into a hotel.

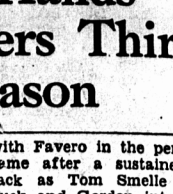

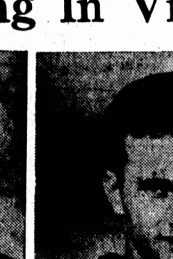

Baseball Rookies Of Year Are Announced

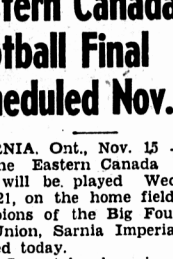
