

Shock of Earthquake.

A slight shock of earthquake was felt at Concord, N. H., at 12:30 o'clock Monday morning, followed sixteen minutes later by a very heavy one lasting several seconds, during which large buildings were shaken. The second shock was accompanied by a heavy rumbling noise which was sufficiently loud to awaken people from their slumbers. Shocks were felt in various portions of the state.

Boots and Shoes.

The Shoe and Leather Reporter avers that manufacturers of boots are gradually working into the production of shoes. There are, undoubtedly, fewer boots worn nowadays in proportion to the population than there used to be. There are many sections of the country still where boots take the lead, but the use of shoes increases much more rapidly. The decreased demand is as applicable to fine calf as to the heavy wax or kip boots. The more extended civilization becomes, the more exacting the people as regards foot wear.

Just What's Wanted.

An inventor of New York City has devised an apparatus that is of interest to Canadian cities and towns. It is one for melting snow in the streets instead of carrying it away in carts. The machine is described as simply a tubular boiler with an open shell, into which snow is dumped as fast as it can be shoveled. At a recent experiment with ten tons of ice, made as nearly like snow as possible, that quantity was melted in about forty minutes; the amount of fuel used is not stated. The cost of carting a load of snow—weight not stated—is 75 cents, without the labor of loading it. The test of efficiency will, of course, lie in the amount of fuel burned for snow removed.

Taxes in the United States.

The Federal Government, says David A. Wells, for the fiscal year 1884 taxed the people of the United States to the extent of \$104,393,625 more than was necessary to defray all ordinary expenditures, including pensions and interest on the public debt. Had this enormous sum of money been remitted to the people, it would have been sufficient to have bought two pairs of boots for every man in this country with an occupation, or two barrels of flour for every family; or it would have added a week's wages to the gain of every manual laborer. It would have paid ten per cent. on a thousand million of capital invested in agriculture, manufactures or mining.

A Practical Joke.

When in Sacramento I met the man who, when a boy, was the cause of my losing a good situation by an attempt to retaliate on him a practical joke he had played on me. I was working at my bench, and a tub of paste was by my side with brushes in it for use, when he took one of those brushes, heavily loaded with paste, and holding it near my face said, "John!" I turned quickly and got the paste on my face and in my hair. I was thoroughly vexed. He ran down the stairs. I took a sheet of paper, and putting perhaps a pint of paste on it and holding it on the palm of my hand waited at the door till he should come. So there I stood, biding my opportunity, when I heard him, as I thought, steadily creeping up the stairs. "Now," I thought, "my boy, you shall have it," and braced myself for the deed. Charlie Ross Again.

A young lad about 15 years of age, light hair and complexion, and blue eyes, was brought to the Journal office, St. Catharines, Ont., on Thursday afternoon. The boy, on being questioned, says he believes that he is 15 or 16 years of age. His first recollection is of playing in Philadelphia with a boy named Anderson, who lived near his parent's residence. He says that his own name is Charlie Ross. He was taken away from his home by a gypsy, who was called John Fleets, in a covered waggon, and given something that set him asleep. After travelling for a considerable time he crossed a long bridge, which he now believes was the Niagara Suspension Bridge. He remained with the gypsies for four or five years, and finally ran away from them at London, Ont., on account of ill-treatment. He then wandered about the country, working for various people and in various places; and for a year or two past in this neighborhood, amongst his employers being Messrs. Newman & Reid, of Port Dalhousie, and Mr. Vine, of this city. Mr. Kingston, of this city, had seen the boy with gypsies, and learning that his name was Charlie Ross took an interest in
