Slowdown In Economic Boom Predicted To Begin In '67

MONTREAL (CP) - Canada's current economic boom should begin to fade by 1967, an industrial economist said here. Dr. W. E. Haviland, economist for the Canadian Pulp and Paper Association, told the annual meeting of the association's woodlands section that a slowdown by 1967 would mean unemployment could not be reduced to the three-per-cent level set by the Economic Council of Canada.

Solid Moved By Pipeline In Alberta

EDMONTON (CP) - The first full-scale movement of a solid material by pipeline has been successful, Alberta Research Council officials said Thursday. The test was made by inserting a 54-pound steel capsule into a 20-inch crude oil pipeline by the Interprovincial Pipe Line Company between Edmonton and Hardisty, Alta., a distance of 109 miles.

Newsprint Co. May Try New Cut In Price

TORONTO (CP) - A study by the investment firm of R. A. Daly says MacMillan, Bodeled and Powell River Co. Ltd. may be considering another cut in the price of newsprint or a shift of traditional markets to try to gain new advantages. MacMillan reduced the North American price of its newsprint \$10 a ton to \$124 last November. Other West Coast producers followed suit, but the reduction has been opposed in Eastern Canada.
