Upturn In Economy Of N.B. Forecast In Throne Speech

FREDERICTON (CP) - A higher level of economic activity throughout New Brunswick this year was predicted in the throne speech read by Lieutenant-Governor J. Leonard O'Brien at the opening of the provincial legislature Thursday.

The speech said improvement is anticipated in woods operations, providing a cut about 15 per cent above last year. Such an increase would have an encouraging effect on many phases of the provincial economy.

The construction industry had been an important factor in the economy during the year and the province had carried out the largest construction program in its history.

Mention was made of the opening of a new mental health clinic in Edmundston during the year, bringing the total of such institutions in the province to four.
