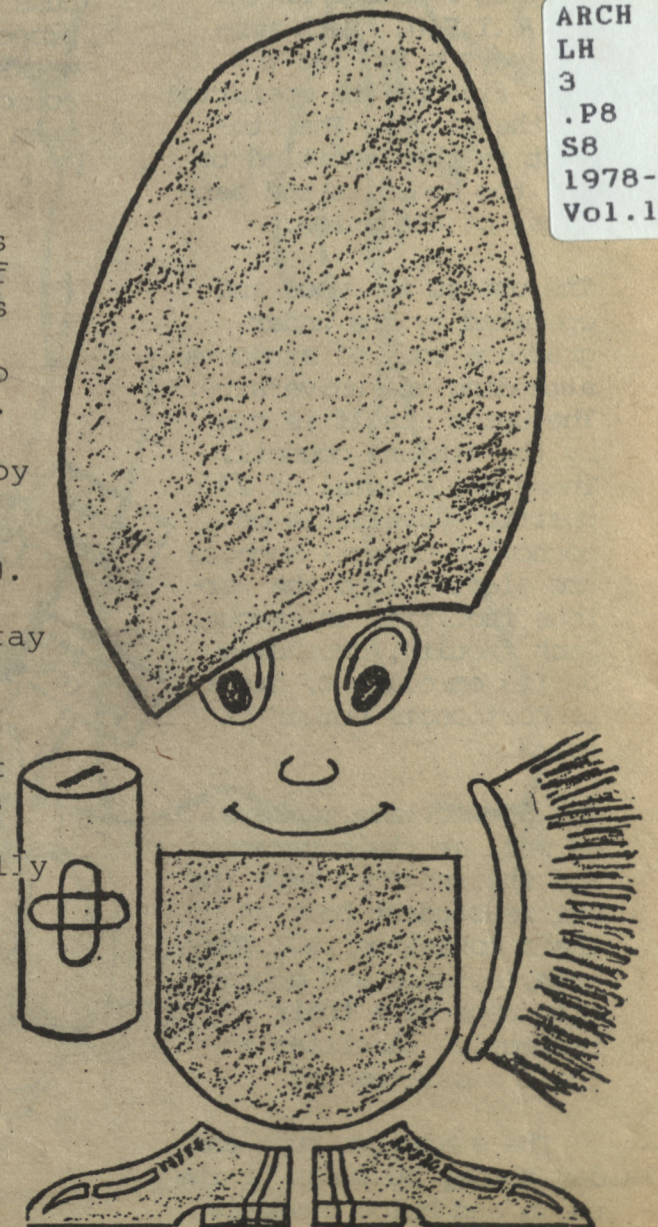

Each team picks a corner in Charlotte-
