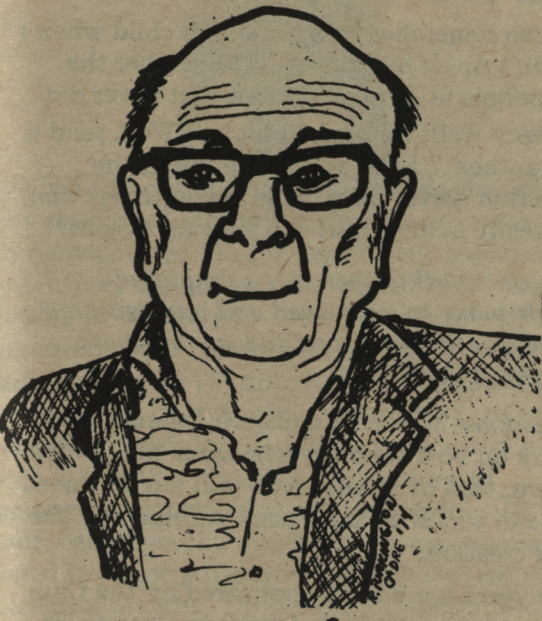


# Noise Night Success But Hockey Team Quiet
