CURRENCIES

MONTREAL (CP) - The United States dollar in terms of Canadian funds was up 3.32 at \$1.07 15-16. Pound sterling was up 5.16 at \$3.02.

NEW YORK

NEW YORK (AP) - In the week's heaviest trading, the stock market drove toward new highs early Friday but backed away from its peak and closed mixed.

Volume swelled to 1,530,000 shares from 4,330,000 Thursday. Brokers ascribed the fading of prices to typical weekend liquidation by traders.

Further news of steel price increases provided a continued bullish atmosphere for the industry. Stocks, however, kept but a small percentage of early gains as some leaders showing minor signs.

The Dow Jones industrial average, after a period of some of its blue chip companies, hung on to a net gain of 8 1/2 points.

The erosion of early prices was so widespread that at the end of the day the list of 3,226 Standard and Poors' issues index showed a small gain of .02 at 72.85.

Analysts bolstered the popular market indicators, Du Pont rose 3 1/2, Texaco 1, and Liggett and Myers 1/2.

Chrysler, the second most stock traded, closed with a net rise of 1 1/2 to 246.20.

Sperry Rand once again was the volume leader, closing unchanged at 19 on 292,700 shares. U.S. Steel was third most active, up 1/4 to 56 on 27,600 shares.

Tobacco continued as a bright spot in the list, recovering from their recent depression. As sugars paralleled the retreat in sugar futures, American Crystal Sugar fell 1/2 and Holly Sugar 2 1/2.

Among a host of other issues, Distillers S & G grams 3/4, Granby Mining 1/2, Gooderham 1/2, Canadian Pacific fell 1/2, Dome Mines and Hudson Bay 1/2, International Nickel 1/2 and Melroe Porcupine 1/2.

Prices on the American Exchange were mixed with Canadian issues generally lower. Canadian National, Fargo Oil and Jupiter fell 1/4, Canadian Javelin 1/2, Molycorp 1/2, Preston 1/2 and Scurry Railway Oil 1/2.

MONTREAL (CP) - The stock market took little heed of the longshoremen's strike, showing substantial gains in most sectors on Montreal and Canadian exchange.

Traders said financial circles were not worried by the strike because of the centres which would destined for Russia could be shipped.

The composite index climbed 0.2 to 126.2 and closed on a net gain of 0.2 to 126.2. Trading was active as industrial shares turned over 187,000 shares and mines and oils showed volume of 85,300 shares.

Papers were strongest, gaining 1.1 to 114.4. Great Lakes gained 1/2, Abitibi rose 1/2, Macmillan-Bloedel and Forest fell 1/2, both 1/2 higher and B.C. Forest added 1/2.
