

# Sudden Storm Sashes Province

High winds and drifting snow slashed into parts of Prince Edward Island last night, causing severe drifting and cutting visibility to near zero in many localities.

Winds in Charlottetown at midnight were from the north-north east at 35-gusting at 50 degrees. Pressure at that time was falling rapidly and light snow and blowing snow was being experienced.

The forecast for today was for four to eight inches of snow to fall during the night, turning to snowflurries at dawn. The high winds will continue until noon today from the northwest with an estimated high temperature of 20 degrees for the Charlottetown area.

The snow was rapidly impacting traffic in the rural areas, especially in the cuttings where visibility was zero. In some areas strong and the snow was fairly heavy. Severe drifting was beginning to block main highways there at midnight.

Monique reported that driving in that area was quite hazardous with light snow and blustering winds. Morell and Souza also reported dangerous driving conditions mainly from poor visibility and drifting snow.

Light snow was reported falling in Summerside.

# Sherbrooke Outlines Side Of Boundary Amendment

A meeting of the Sherbrooke School Board was held last night in connection with the proposed boundary changes between Summerside and Sherbrooke.

After the meeting, the following statement was released by school trustees: Fred Macdonald, chairman; Province Chapel, Adrian Decker and Urban Laughlin, secretary.

"Three years ago without warning, Hillcrest Housing Ltd., through the legislature, were successful in changing the boundaries of their choice, assessment land from Sherbrooke to Summerside without any agreement or prior notice to the Sherbrooke School District."

The land was taken from Sherbrooke principally for the construction of a 225 housing units and since this project has been dropped Sherbrooke District is convinced that the legislature should now return the property, which includes Creekside, Dairy Crest and 140

north of the Pope Road Extension.

"On Feb. 15, five copies of a letter requesting this change of boundaries were sent to the two MLAs of 4th Prince, one of 5th Prince and one of 6th Prince, representing both political parties, and in addition on behalf of the Sherbrooke School District."

"Earlier this week telegrams were sent to the premier, a leader of opposition by the school board presenting its political case."

The Sherbrooke District has cooperated over the years with the Town of Summerside in many ways but since this new housing development is out, the fact that overhead is high structure, building our new school three years ago plus the fact that this land belonged to the district for many generations, we feel well within our rights in making these requests for boundary restoration to Sherbrooke."

The trustees announced last night that the statement from the meeting will again be sent to the premier and the MLAs.

# Teachers Fed. Blacklists Pontiac Board

The P.E.I. Teachers Federation requests that members not apply for any positions which may be advertised by the Central School Board in the province of Quebec.

Miss Ann Riley, general secretary of the teachers' federation stated that there was nothing unusual about it.

The reason for the request was that she had received word from the counterpart organization in Quebec that three teachers in Shawville had been "unjustly dismissed."

The advertisement requesting P.E.I. teachers not apply for positions with the Pontiac Board was placed on the basis of this information.


