RECORD BREAKING.
 The Latest Counts the Cost in the Bicycle Arena.

Another of those abnormal feats to which we have more than once drawn public attention has been accomplished. One of the great "record breakers" has set all his competitors at defiance by his only and valiant effort of cycling from the Lantz's Bend to John's Head in 98 hours, fifteen minutes—that is, nine hours and forty minutes quicker than the "old" record. We are informed that he experienced little fatigue, and to all appearances he was not in any way injured by his success; but the most remarkable part in this act is included in the fact that he performed his task without indulging in one moment of sleep. He was three days, fourteen hours and fifteen minutes without reclining once, or resting or ceasing his active movement of propulsion, except for the very briefest moments.

We know from the best experimental proofs that a healthy heart will beat 100,000 times in twenty-four hours, and that the lowest estimate of the work done by that labor is equal to lifting 122 tons one foot; but it has recently been shown that cycling tells severely and specially upon the circulation, and the motor of the stroke of the heart is doubled during such active exercise as that to which the rider subjected himself, so that the lowest estimate we can assume for the stroke of his heart each day was 212,000 beats, with work done of 244 foot tons; and this maintained for three days and fourteen hours and fifteen minutes was equal to more than 834 foot tons without repose. The experiment, for it must be looked upon physiologically as an experiment, is not without its uses. It shows that there remains much that is as yet unexplained in respect to the cause of sleep, suggesting, indeed, that there is something in persistent motion of the blood, sustained by volition of a resolute kind, which prevents the nervous system from passing into that passive or negative state which the term "sleep" is applied. The practical lesson we are most called to dwell upon, however, bears on the ultimate influence of extreme exercise on the bodies of these young men who make themselves the victims of self-inflicted injury.

The report of a feat such as we have related may suggest that, for the moment, the athlete has sustained no harm, and that all our teaching is so much needless admonition, or, as it is sometimes designated, "grandmotherly care." We wish it were so. Unfortunately we know that these violent strains, both in the end, the certainty of premature decrepitude. Toward the goal of death the best heart can only perform a certain measure of work, and whether it be done by rapid or slow process determines the length of days in which it is done. Theoretically, therefore, it is the fate of these young competitors, who otherwise might be destined for a long and active existence, to succumb or break down before the sun of their life has reached its full and glorious maturity. In fact, the process practically, this so far, has been the fate of all who have endeavored, under the applause of their unthinking comrades, to do what nature has not constructed them for doing without risk and without ultimately proclaiming to them in a voice stronger than theirs that she, after all, is the mistress of their destiny.—The Lancet.
