### BATTLE OF THE OFFICERS.

Probable that Col Strathy  
 "Must Go."

For His Recent Breach of Discipline.

OTTAWA, Nov. 29.—It is regarded as a  
 foregone conclusion that Colonel Strathy,  
 Commandant of the 58th Royal Scots, of  
 Montreal, will be dismissed for his critic-  
 ism in the press of General Gascoigne.

### A TERRIBLE TYPHOON.

Bringing Death to 6,400  
 Persons.

One of the Worst Disasters Reported  
 from the Southern Ocean.

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 29.—A typhoon  
 which swept over the Philippine Islands on  
 the sixth of October, was the cause of one  
 of the worst disasters that has been report-  
 ed from the Southern ocean in many years.  
 The damage to property was something  
 appalling. Fully four hundred Europeans  
 were drowned and it is estimated that six  
 thousand natives perished.

### ANOTHER DEAL.

Sir Henry Joly to be Shelved.

Ottawa Political Changes Pending.

MONTREAL, Nov. 29.—Lieut.-Governor  
 Patterson, of Montreal, is expected here  
 today. He has been sent for in connection  
 with the important political changes now  
 pending. Sir Henry Joly will likely retire  
 from the Ministry soon and if Mr. Pat-  
 terson can be induced to accept a transfer to  
 the governorship of the Northwest Territories,  
 Sir Henry Joly will probably succeed him  
 at Winnipeg.

Conservative Victory in Mani-  
 toba.

A Seat Wrested From The Government.

WINNIPEG, Nov. 29.—The government  
 of this province suffered a reverse on  
 Saturday, in the by-election at White  
 Mountain, when Johnson, the Conservative  
 candidate was elected to replace Moel,  
 Liberal, deceased, by 159 majority. Both  
 sides put up a great fight. This is con-  
 sidered the first blood for Hugh John  
 McDonald.

### THE WORKING-GIRL IN SOCIETY.

If Tactful, Well-Mannered and Tastefully  
 Dressed She Will be Welcomed.

"The social position of the working  
 girl is recognized, and it is with her to be  
 a success in society or not," writes Ruth  
 Ashmore in the December Ladies' Home  
 Journal, of "The Social Position of the  
 Girl Who Works." "She is quick of  
 wit, and she need make no mistakes if she  
 notes what the older women do. She will  
 be wise if she makes for herself a friend  
 of some woman in society who is older  
 than herself, and who is kind of heart.  
 But she must not presume upon her kind-  
 ness. The girl who works, like the girl  
 whose duties are in her own home, must  
 learn what tact means.

"A well-mannered, tastefully dressed,

 is not a social necessity, but a desirable  
 personality is. Therefore, make yourself  
 agreeable. Share your pleasures with your

 bour has a joy you shall be invited to di-  
 vide it with her. Selfishness is a girl's  
 social ruin. Tact, which is society's word  
 for consideration and sympathy, is the art  
 you must cultivate. And that is tact after  
 all? It is saying and doing the right thing  
 at the right time and in the right place,  
 and that is nothing more than you are  
 asked to do by the greatest of all Teachers  
 'the doing unto others as you would they  
 should do unto you.'"
