

## Changing of the Guard at the Library!!

The following article was received by the Cadre from Merritt Crockett, the head of the UPEI library, explaining the new Book Checkout Procedure and is being printed here for the benefit of all library users:

The library of the University of Prince Edward Island has been fortunate in receiving a budget that has allowed it to substantially increase the library collection since the formation of the University of Prince Edward Island. In the past two years, however, several thousand dollars worth of materials have been taken from the library. In addition to this heavy financial loss, the Library faces the problems of not being able to repurchase much of this material because it is out of print and library users are being denied access to materials that should be available to them. Early in 1972 the University Community was advised through the Cadre of this problem and of the alternatives available to the library should materials continue to leave the library without going through proper circulation procedures.

In November, 1972 the Senate Library Committee unanimously recommended to Senate the following motion: "That a control desk be established in the Library, that personnel be hired to check materials, briefcases, etc. leaving the library and that this be considered a

priority item." The intent of this motion was that all materials of all library users would be inspected before leaving the library. This motion was passed without dissent at the Senate Meeting of December 11, 1972.

All library users, including the library staff will be required to present materials, briefcases, etc. to the persons in charge of the control desk for inspection before leaving the library. Although this service will be conducted as speedily as possible, library users should allow sufficient time for these checkout procedures so that they will be on time for classes and other activities. It is our hope that the inconvenience of such procedures will be offset by the objectives the Library will achieve which will be to give all members of the

University Community equal access to University materials and permit the Library staff to give better service to library users while protecting the University's investment in the Library.

## Obituary

The University community was shocked to learn of the death of Dr. Roy DeVerl Willey who was killed when struck by a snowplow, in the K-mart parking lot. A visiting professor in education, Dr. Willey came to UPEI in the summer of 1972.

"He brought with him an unrivaled wealth of academic and professional experience," commented Dr. Edward Edmonds, Dean of the Faculty of Education. "With his shrewd mixture of scholarship and practical experience he had made himself a most acceptable and popular colleague both with the staff and with the students in the Faculty of Education. His modesty, his erudition, his quiet charm of manner made him very dear to all who came in contact with him, and he will be much missed," said Dean Edmonds.

Dr. Willey held degrees from the University of Wyoming (B.A., English, Spanish and Music); Brigham Young University (M.A. in School Administration) and Stanford University (Ph.D. in Educational Psychology).

He is survived by his wife, the former Helen Young (great-granddaughter of Brigham Young), and six children. Burial took place in Salt Lake City, Utah.

Students from every University paper across Canada, with few exceptions were present. It was an excellent opportunity to meet, exchange ideas and learn more about Canadian University papers.

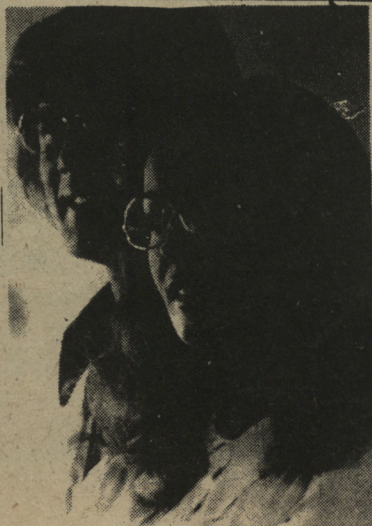
The Cadre was represented by Carol Patterson, Editor, and Kathy Roach, Staffmember. Problems relating to the Cadre were discussed. Two major problems - getting staff and Finance were talked about.

CUP is the oldest National Student press organization in the world dating back to the 1920's. It is a co-operative news service which entitles newspapers to news, features cartoons, advertising, etc. ~~printed trice-weekly~~ that are contained in a newsletter printed and distributed to members thrice weekly.

The head office is in Ottawa where officals organize its services. Canada is divided into three regions: Atlantic Regional - ARCUP; Ontario Regional - ORCUP; Western Regional - WRCUP. This year the ARCUP conference was held in St. John's NFLD. and three representatives from U.P.E.I. attended. Next year the regional will be held here with the Cadre acting as hosts.

It is interesting to know that University Newspapers have some organization and co-operation. The Cadre would like to see more students on this campus involved in the production of the paper.
