Local and Other Items.

ATTRIBUTED TO RATS.—The Montreal Fire Commissioners have commenced an investigation into the cause of the disastrous fire at the Webster Hotel, in which several people lost their lives, and others were severely injured. It is believed that the fire was caused by rats lighting some matches.

A POPULAR COMMANDER.—Captain Robert Fraser, master of the Black Diamond Line steamer Coban, and Mrs Fraser, are guests of Dr and Mrs E J Johnstone. Capt Fraser did not go on the steamer on her last trip up the St. Lawrence, but spent a few days at his home, Charlottetown. This is the first occasion in thirteen years that he has been away from his command. Captain "Bob" is one of the most popular commanders on the St. Lawrence route.—Sydney Advocate.

HALIFAX PRICES.—The Herald of Saturday says: Dealers are selling P. E. Island potatoes ex-vessel at 28c to 29c per bushel. The probability is that they will not go much lower, though possibly the price may touch 25c. Turnips are selling at 20 to 22c, and carrots, parsnips and beets at 4c per bushel. There has been a glut of eggs in the market, due to large consignments from P. E. Island, but the price has not varied from 14c for imported eggs and 15 for Nova Scotia stock. The surplus is being slowly worked off, after which prices will doubtless advance. Island oats in bulk are selling at 36 to 38c.

Newfoundland Chips In.

St. John's, Nfld., Nov. 3.—The Newfoundland Government is considering a proposal to form half the colonial police into a company for service in the Transvaal. The Canadian Government will be requested, it is understood, to incorporate this company with the second Canadian regiment, Newfoundland paying a proportionate share of the expenses. The colonial police, being like the Royal Irish Constabulary, a semi-military body, armed and well drilled and fully equipped, could take the field at once. The scheme meets with general popular approval.
