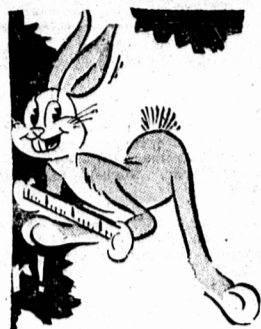

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Work Starts At Darnley Harbour

Work commenced yesterday on the construction of a breakwater at Darnley Harbour. This breakwater will be built of creosoted piling with a fill and can also be used as a wharf. The purpose of the breakwater is to make the harbor of more benefit to fishermen as it will provide a safe anchorage behind the sand bars. Darnley Basin was dredged about two years ago and the construction of this breakwater will permit further dredging which will make it possible for boats to come in closer to shore. It is further dredging was done without the breakwater being built it would soon fill in again with sand. This work is being done because of the interest of Mr. J. Watson MacNaught, M.P. who said yesterday that at Darnley Basin shows much promise of becoming one of the best fishing harbors on the north side of the island. Mr. Ralph Ford of Emmore is foreman of the job.
