# Yanks Annoyed By French Move

PARIS (AP)—France's virtual removal of her Mediterranean fleet from all NATO obligations has stirred a bitter backroom fight in the Atlantic Alliance.

Officially the French would only confirm the decision to retain command of their Mediterranean Fleet in time of war was taken because of what France considers its special responsibilities in the Mediterranean. This means the guarding of links with Algeria, where a nationalist rebellion endangers vast French holdings.
