Mr. Sedgewick, Deputy Minister of Justice, on being spoken to in regard to the attempted revolt of convicts at Kingston Penitentiary, said: "We received notification of the plot on Thursday last, through Warden Lavell, who arrived here in person."

We received permission to use the troops, and the Warden left at once with the order. Sir John Thompson also went at once to Kingston, and the uprising was neatly nipped in the bud. The intelligence of the mutiny was received from one of the convicts who was friendly to the Warden, and who warned him secretly, so that he might escape with his life. The information of the plot also reached us from an outside source. A man had been applied to for means to escape, if the mutiny was successful."
