Successor To Sir James Dunn Is Selected

SAULT STE. MARIE, Ont. (CP) David S. Holbrook, 44 executive vice-president of the Algoma Steel Corporation has been elected president of the steel empire built by the late Sir James Dunn, the board announced Tuesday.

The company also announced the election of two other top-level officials of subsidiary companies. George W. MacLeod, vice-president and general manager of Algoma Ore Properties which operates the giant Helen mine at nearby Michipicoten, has been elected president of that organization.

Mr. Allen, vice-president and general manager of the Canadian Furnace Company at Port Colborne was named president. JOINED FIRM IN 1944

Sir James took Mr. Holbrook to Sault Ste. Marie in 1944 as assistant general manager. The following year Mr. Holbrook became executive assistant to the president. He was elected executive vice-president and a director in 1949. He was also vice-president of Algoma Ore and a director of several of the subsidiaries.

Mr. Holbrook was formerly with the Carnegie-Illinois Steel Corporation.

Sir James' death last Jan. 1 left Mr. Holbrook as senior executive officer and, pending settlement of the steel magnate's estate he has been directing the company.

Bowater Plans Another Mill

LONDON (CP) - The Bowater Corporation of North America, with pulp mills in Newfoundland, has decided "in principle" to build another mill in Canada, it was announced Tuesday.

Sir Eric Bowater, the corporation's chairman, told the general meeting in Croydon the proposed groundwood pulp mill would have a capacity of 100,000 tons of pulp annually.

"The location of this mill has not yet been determined but we are busily investigating various alternative possibilities that may be open to us," he did not elaborate. But in his address he revealed that Bowater's Newfoundland Pulp and Paper Mills, the Canadian company with mills at Corner Brook, Nfld., planned capital expenditures of \$4,500,000 this year.

PLAN NEW INSTALLATION The Bowater Power Company plans an immediate installation of a \$2,500,000 hydro-electric power plant on a site adjacent to Corner Brook.

"This project," said Sir Eric, "is expected to be completed by the end of 1957 and I am glad to be able to tell you that by far the larger part of the necessary plant and equipment has been ordered from the United Kingdom."

The new facilities will generate 13,500 kilowatts.

Bowater also announced it will build a new pulp mill near Rock Hill in York County, S.C.

Bowater already owns a pulp and newsprint mill at Calhoun, Tenn. Bowater said production there has reached 212,000 tons a year and the company is considering expansion to 400,000 tons.

Found Fit To Stand Trial

TORONTO (CP) - Joseph Levisanno, 38, whose appeal against a death sentence was upheld on mental grounds, Monday was found fit to stand trial again for murder in connection with the Oct. 23 slaying of the woman he lived with, 41-year-old Pearl Roy.

Mental health experts told an assize jury that Levisanno is mentally fit to be tried again.

In January he was convicted of murder and Chief Justice J. C. McRuer sentenced him to be hanged April 12. The Ontario Court of Appeal, however, quashed the conviction on grounds that Levisanno's mental fitness was not correctly considered by the jury.
