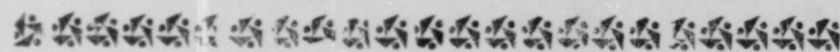

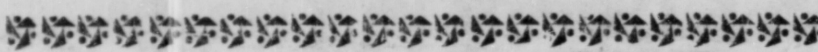

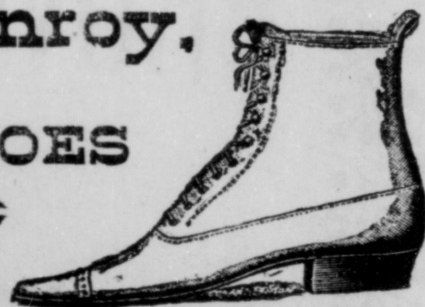

AN ABLE GENERAL.

New Commander-in-Chief of British Forces in South Africa

LONDON, Aug. 16.—Gen. Walker, who replaces Gen. Buller as commander-in-chief of the British troops in South Africa is regarded as one of the ablest generals in the army. His appointment, therefore, is taken to indicate that the situation is grave. Lieutenant-General Sir Francis William Edward Forester-Walker, K. C. B. G., has been in command of the western military district of Great Britain since 1895. He is the eldest son of the late Sir Edward W. Forester-Walker K. C. B., was born in 1844 and entered the service in 1862, joining the Scots Guards. He served in the Kaffir war of 1876-78, was military secretary of Sir Bartle Frere from 1878 to 1879; served during the Zulu war; was quartermaster general in Bechuanaland 1884; commanded the infantry brigade of Aldershot from 1889 to 1890, and commanded the troops in Egypt from 1890 to 1895.

PARIS PLOT THAT FAILED.

Members of League of Patriots Were Ready for Revolution

LONDON, Aug. 16.—A despatch to the Daily News from Paris says that the attack on M Labori was only the tail of the storm which would have swept over Rennes had the plot that was hatched in Paris succeeded.

The plot was no laughing matter. It was to have ripened into revolutionary demonstrations on the boulevards on Sunday. The conspirators were to make bonfires of the Dreyfusite newspapers in the streets and burn the kiosks where they were sold. This would have resulted in the calling out of the troops. The latter, however, were to reverse arms and refuse to act. After this some cavalry were to help the movement.

Telephone messages were to be sent to different points where members of the League of Patriots were assembled. They were to rush to the Republican and Socialist newspaper offices, seize their staffs and hold their printers. Simultaneously rushes were to be made on the Palace of the Elvee, and the Ministries of the Interior and Posts and Telegrams, when news would have been wired to the provinces that Paris had revolted. A war minister nominated by the Duke of Orleans was to replace Gen. Gallifet.

Two days previous to the intended execution of the plot, M. Lerine, Prefect of Police, received full information regarding it. The conspirators are now under arrest, and ought to be tried by the Senate sitting as a High Court.

Americans Defeat Filipinos

MANILA, Aug. 16.—The Filipinos sustained a severe defeat before the town of Angeles today. Ten companies of the twelfth infantry with two cannons attacked twenty-five hundred of the insurgents who were entrenched near the town. A fierce fight followed, the Filipinos being worsted and driven back disordered with a loss of two hundred. The Americans had two killed and twelve wounded. The Twelfth occupied Angeles and are holding the town.

**MAITRE LABORI  
IS RECOVERING  
Will be Able to Return  
to Court**

AND ASSUME DIRECTION OF HIS CASE NEXT MONDAY.

Madame Labori has Received Several Menacing Letters.

RENNES, Aug. 18.—Maitre Labori was able to leave his bed for three hours yesterday and even to walk thrice across his room last night.

The doctors think that he will be able to be present at next Monday's session of the Dreyfus court martial.

Mme. Labori has received a number of menacing letters. One that reached her said that the writer regretted that the would-be assassin had nailed only Labori and not also his wife and children.

ANOTHER BIG STEEL WORKS

To be Erected at North Sydney, Cape Breton.

HALIFAX, Aug. 16.—A Sydney despatch says another huge iron and steel works, eclipsing even the Whitney establishment will be located at North Sydney. Information has been received from England that a deal is about to be consummated to merge the Nova Scotia Steel Co. of New Glasgow and the general mining association. The latter is the oldest coal company in Cape Breton and the directors are all Englishmen. A representative of the N. S. Steel Company has been in England consulting with the directors of the Coal Co. The new concern's plant at North Sydney will include a shipbuilding plant, steel rail plant and dock. The company owns iron mines at Belleisle, N.S., and it is said that 30,000 tons of ore have been sold in Europe for immediate delivery. The concern will have a capital of twenty-five millions, principally English.

The Shamrock Arrives
