The British Empire even waged a war on China, the so-called Opium War of 1839-1842, mainly to protect its profitable opium trade. Although the British traffic finally ceased in 1917, some Chinese feudal warlords started cultivating opium, while other traders, both foreign and domestic, resumed the smuggling trade. It was not until the Chinese Communist Revolution that the flow of opium was finally stopped in 1949.

It is doubtful that racist sentiment was behind arguments in favor of the Narcotics Control Act. In light of the historical record, the use of the opium addiction of some early Chinese-Canadians as an argument in favor of legalizing marijuana cultivation is out of context and highly illogical.
