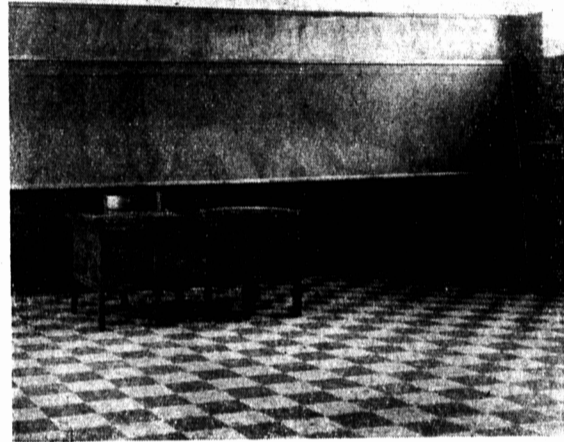
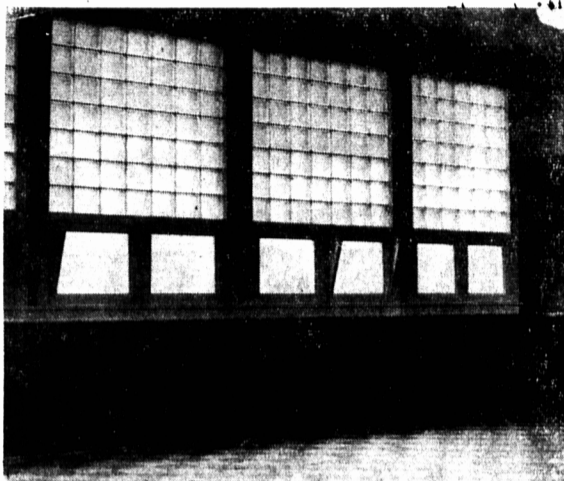


# Official Opening Of New School At Carleton Scheduled Today

—In a program beginning at 8 p.m. this evening, local residents and officials of the Provincial Government and Department of Education will attend the official opening of the new school at Carleton.

Equipped with air-conditioning and oil heating, this modern school has three well-lighted classrooms on the main floor, while the basement contains a community auditorium which extends the full length of the building.

Work on the project began on November 9, 1953. The basement was dug in two days, and when the forms were completed the cement was poured in 18 hours.

From 12 to 14 men, for the most part local workmen, were employed under the direction of Mr. Harry Muttart, of Carleton, who was foreman of the job and chairman of the building committee.

Other members on the building committee were Ralph MacCaull and Hedley Muttart.

This building, measuring 25 x 96 feet, is located near the former school on somewhat more than an acre of land which was purchased from Mr. John Haslam.

The school part of the building is approached by cement steps leading to a double door which opens into the main entry. Here is located hat racks and coat hangers for the children of the two larger rooms.

In a recess on one side of the entry is a drinking fountain and on this side is a door leading to the basement. On the other side of the main entry is the boys wash-room.

The building proper measures 25 x 90, and the room on each end of the building each measures 25 x 90, while the center room, which is designed for the youngest grades, has its own cloak-room facilities, and is 31 x 19.

The ceilings throughout the school are 11 feet in height, with the first four feet of wall finished in masonry, the next four feet in akumite, followed by two feet of zonnacona board painted white, and the remaining foot painted pink or green.

The ceiling is finished in sixteen inch squares of Donnacona board painted white, and the floors are laid with heavy red and white tiles.

Natural light is provided through spacious windows, which for the most part, are the glass block type.

Four lighting fixtures in each classroom and three in the corridor also insure adequate electric lighting for any occasion.

Four inches of insulation cover the walls and ceiling throughout the building. In each classroom a green colored "black-board" extends the full width of the room.

The community auditorium extending the full length of the building is located in the basement. Entry to this auditorium is made by single doors in the west end of the building and in the main entrance at the front.

Behind the stage at the east end of the auditorium is a kitchen, and in front of the stage the seating facilities occupies an area 25 x 55, extending in a gradual slant towards the stage at the back of the auditorium.

In the basement is the air conditioning and heating unit, and electric water pump and pressure tank.

It is expected that Hon. A. V. Matheson, Premier of the Province; L. W. Shaw, Deputy Minister of Education; and C. B. Jelly, district supervisor, will be among those present for the official opening of this modern school building which is reported to have cost approximately \$23,000.

One of the highlights of a brief program in connection with the official opening will be the presentation of an address on the history of Carleton school district by Mr. Albert Muttart, the district's oldest lifetime resident.

On completion of the ceremonies the women of the district will serve

a buffet lunch. Members of the present school board are A. A. MacCallum, Harold Muttart, Elmer Stordy, and Raymond Harvey is the secretary.

The two present teachers are Mrs. Ralph Connelly and Miss Marion Cairns.

## Discuss Disaster Service Branch For Alberton

—Tuesday afternoon Mr. Gordon MacDonald of Charlottetown, chairman of the Red Cross disaster service committee for Prince Edward Island, and Mrs. Harry W. Cudmore, director of first aid, met with a group of representative citizens of Alberton to discuss organizing a branch of the disaster service which would serve the western part of Prince County.

Present at the meeting were town policeman Walter Hogan, Cpl. William Warner of the R. C. M. P.; Dr. V. E. Robinson, Mayor Hilton Barbour, Messrs. D. B. Nicholson, Henry Clarke, Heath Profile, Mrs. Roy Leard and Mrs. A. C. Green.

In explaining the purpose of the disaster service, Mr. MacDonald explained that it was an auxiliary agent. In case of any major disaster such as enemy action, the Red Cross disaster service would work under civil defense. In smaller disasters the Red Cross would take charge. Mr. MacDonald suggested that perhaps the term "emergency" would be preferable to that of "disaster". An effort is being made to gear organization to suit local conditions.

It was suggested by Cpl. Warner that the most likely disasters to occur in this area would be fire, drowning and highway accidents. Should the need arise, the Red Cross disaster service would, in these situations, work with the fire department, the police and doctors.

The importance of having men as well as women trained in first aid was stressed. Dr. Robinson volunteered to instruct a class if such were organized. Messrs. Heath Profile, Hilton Barbour and Henry Clarke were appointed a committee to organize such a class. In addition to an "overall" chairman to be the contact person, the local organization would require chairmen (and assistants) or first aid, shelter, transportation, food, clothing and registration committees.

It was decided that after the first aid class is organized a group of citizens should be again called together for further organization.

## Alberton's Old Landmark Demolished



—Pictured above in the first stages of demolition is an old building which has been a landmark in Alberton for more years than the oldest citizen can remember. Although the date of its erection cannot be learned, the house is known to have stood on the west side of the main street for more than one hundred years.

In recent years the building has been permitted to fall into a regrettable state of disrepair and has come to be considered a fire hazard. Nevertheless it has stood unscathed through fires which destroyed adjacent buildings. About 1896 fire destroyed the buildings on the north on lots now housing the business premises of White and Son, C. B. Leard and Myricks Alberton Ltd. In 1917 fire swept to within a few feet of its south wall when the entire business section on the west side of main street was razed.

The house was built by Mr. Edwin Wallace and lumber for its construction was sawn from trees removed from the lot on which it stands. The work of demolition has revealed a heavy framework still in excellent condition. Floors of two-inch plank are fitted together with groove and tongue as it was made in that day (grooves sawn in the planks and a tongue inserted.) Joists are mortised and the flooring is secured with wooden pegs several inches long and almost an inch in diameter. . . .

In the beginning Mr. Wallace did not live in the house himself but rented it to Mr. and Mrs. Ireland who carried on a small business in one part of it. A number of men and women still living in Alberton can remember buying candy there in their childhood, some of it being made by Mrs. Ireland herself. Following the fire of 1896, which destroyed his place of residence, Mr. Wallace and his family lived in the house for some years.

The next long-time resident of the premises was Mr. William Wells and his little Confectionary Store is well remembered by some who do not yet class themselves as the older generation. More recent occupants have

been Dr. Cummings and Mr. Waldo Matthews, Jr. About two years ago Mrs. William Wells and her daughter came back to live in their old home. They returned again to St. John, N. B., last week.

Various small businesses have been carried on in the section of the building used as a store by Mr. Ireland and Mr. Wells. Its most recent has been Mr. Gordon Jeffrey, Barber.

The north section of the building which has been occupied by another barber, Mr. Alvin Bell,

for the past 28 years is not part of the original structure but a later addition. The property has been purchased by Messrs. Fred and Gordon White and it is understood that they will erect a modern structure on the site of this old one which probably stood there in the days when the present town of Alberton was only a place where a few buildings had sprung up at the intersection of two roads and was known as "The Cross," and the surrounding area was covered with trees and pine stumps.

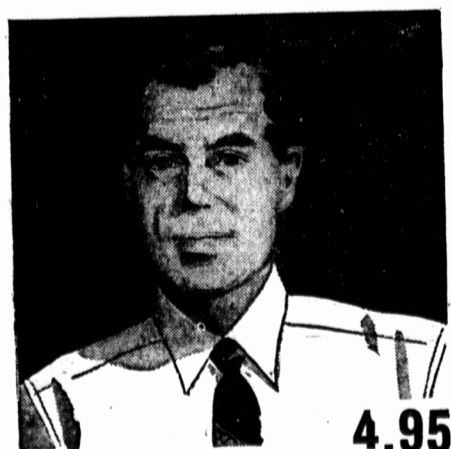
