Canadian Research Team Ends Easter Island Job

MONTREAL (CP)—Two unforgettable months have ended for Canadian researchers who made Easter Island the world's farthest from anywhere medical laboratory.

They set sail for home Saturday aboard the Canadian navy repair ship Cape Scott after a send-off of magnificent proportions. The islanders threw a sa-sau—a lobster-broil with the added spice of hips swaying to Polynesian melodies—and, judging by brief radio accounts, it sent song and laughter ringing towards the stars.

Homeward bound, the Cape Scott is carrying a much lighter load than it did on arrival in mid-December. The expedition's trailer accommodation was left behind to provide the framework for a permanent biological station and for hospital facilities to be maintained by the Chilean government.

Assorted scientific apparatus was also left, along with a truck to help in island transport, playground equipment for the children and a film projector for showing pictures of what life is like in the world outside.

The majority of the 32 expedition scientists are from Canadian universities. With compatriots from the United Kingdom, the United States, Scandinavia and Switzerland, they have been working under the leadership of Dr. Stanley Skoryna of McGill University here.

The scientists are returning, they believe, with the most complete evaluation ever obtained of disease in relation to an isolated environment.

traila — and isolation will be ended forever. During the expedition visit, every one of the 950 islanders was examined, while other scientists ran checks on water and soil samples over the entire 64 square miles of the bit of Pacific nowhere.

One intriguing bit of information is that the islanders—enthusiastic cigarette smokers—show few traces of cancer. But, scientists say, this could be because cigarettes are not always available.

Time allowing, zoological samples will be collected.
