

Biology Club loses \$170

not quite pay for the expense of the event. The Homecoming Dance was a complete flop with only about 30 couples in attendance.

Despite past evidence, the Biology Club decided to try holding a sock-hop in the gym to raise funds for a Maritime Biology Conference which will be held at UPEI later this semester. Bob Gillis, representing the Biology Club, requested the Student Union backing in case of a flop, as the Biology Club did not have sufficient funds to back it themselves. An arrangement was worked out.

The dance was held with *Captain Jake* playing in the gym last Friday, the 12th of January. It turned out to be one of the biggest Social catastrophes of the year, ranking second only to the Home-Coming Semi-formal. Approximately 70 people showed up to pay the \$1 admission fee. This left the Biology Club with a deficit of close to \$170. This event brings to light the changing trend here at UPEI at gives a final definite answer to those who whine about the "good old days". 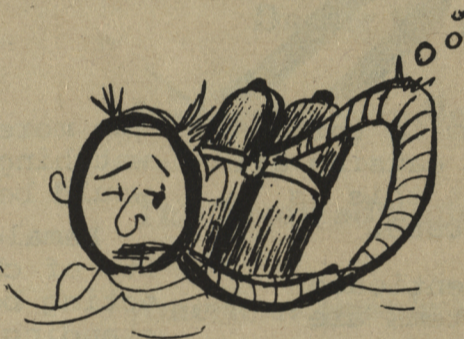
