Montague Trade Board Seeks To Beautify Road

Little noticed by travellers coming into Montague are 200 young ornamental trees bordering the approaches to the town.

Two years ago the Board of Trade, undertook the planting of these trees. The project was supervised by Mr. R. K. Clements. The merchants were canvassed and approximately \$200.00 was raised, this sum being duplicated by the Provincial Government, under the rural beautification plan.

The trees purchased from the Cotton Nursery consisted of flowering crab, cherry, and English hawthorne. They were planted alternately except at low spots where weeping willows were set out.

In a few years when the trees mature the beauty of the town will be really enhanced by the beauty of its approaches. The owners of property on which trees were planted had more or less taken over their care.
