Rotarians Elect Officers; Hear Report On Red Cross

R. E. Seller was elected president of the Charlottetown Rotary Club following the submission of a report by the slate committee at the weekly luncheon meeting held at the Charlottetown Hotel yesterday.

Rotarian R. C. Baetz, Assistant National Commissioner Red Cross was special guest speaker, with George Fisher and Neil Matheson as co-chairman.

Speaking from on-the-spot experience, Mr. Baetz went to Austria with the first medical team of the International Red Cross in 1956, dealt with many situations which developed and were met with by the Red Cross during his seven years with headquarters in Geneva.

Touching on the situation in Canada, Mr. Baetz said that over \$200,000 was distributed last year by the Disaster Service on minor disasters. Outpost hospitals were conducted by the Red Cross at 65 places from the Atlantic to the Pacific while in the Far North areas Red Cross nurses made 35,000 visits and performed much of the work usually done by doctors when available. 3,000 children were brought into the world by these nurses last year. 13,000 visits were made to veteran hospitals by volunteer workers. These visits are a source of real enjoyment to the Vets who do not hesitate to say so," Mr. Baetz said.

Selwyn Lloyd Seen Most Unpopular In U.K. Gov't

LONDON (CP)—Political observers are in general agreement that the winner by a landslide in an unpopular poll of the members of Prime Minister Macmillan's cabinet would be Foreign Secretary Selwyn Lloyd, the man who only two years ago made headlines as "the luckiest politician of the year."

Undoubtedly an element of luck played its part when Lloyd rose within 12 months from a minor government post to the foreign office, a position that gave him power and prestige second only to that of his prime minister, Sir Anthony Eden. But the breaks have gone against him with appalling consistency for the last 15 months.

When the little-known Lloyd became foreign secretary in December, 1955, his detractors suggested that Eden, after his long experience in the same job, had chosen an errand-boy, through whom he would continue to handle external affairs.

In his early months office, the able, hard-working minister seemed to be living down the slur against his formidable political record, which started when he became a "boy-wonder" chairman of the urban district council

of the Liverpool suburb of Hoylake at the age of 32.

TALENTED NEGOTIATOR
He quickly enhanced his reputation by displaying a talent for patient, earnest negotiation, a concentration on dealing with specific issues rather than broad generalities and the reported ability to express himself bluntly and effectively in private sessions with his opposite numbers abroad.

Lloyd's chief weakness lay in his limited talents for House of Commons oratory and his consequent inability to build up a personal following within the Conservative party.

But it was only after the 1956 Suez crisis brought a decisive turn in Lloyd's fortunes that his liabilities began to outweigh his assets.

Although Lloyd is known to have taken an early unfavorable view of Egypt's President Nasser, it will probably never be known whether he played a decisive role in Britain's military intervention in Egypt in October, 1956, or whether Eden was indeed using his foreign secretary as the mouthpiece for his own policies.

over the party rift over Suez itself, but he was not equally successful in restoring confidence in his foreign secretary. And even loyal government supporters were painfully struck by the contrast in Lloyd's pedestrian speeches in the House with the brilliance of Aneurin Bevan, Labor's foreign affairs spokesman.

Lloyd stuck it out, despite a growing drumfire of speculation as to his successor.

In a television interview Sunday, Macmillan dealt with the point firmly, reaffirming his faith in Lloyd and announcing that he plans to make no changes.

But the government's increasingly poor showing in byelections guarantees that political commentators will continue to find it logical that an unpopular government should get rid of its least popular minister. Selwyn Lloyd is unlikely to be in the running for the title of luckiest politician of 1958.

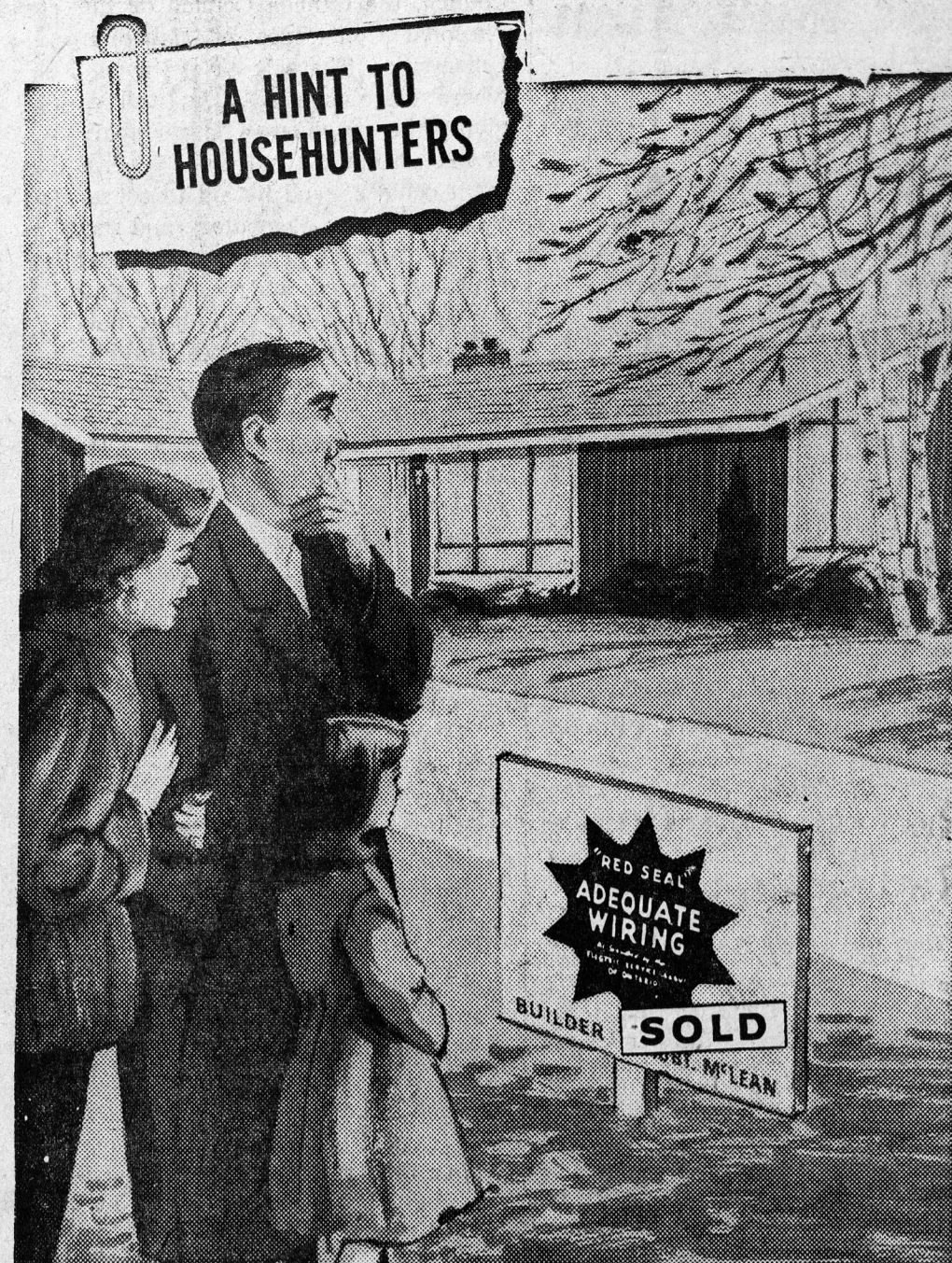
Traffic Cases Heard In Court

Convicted of driving a motor vehicle whilst impaired a Charlottetown resident was fined \$75 and costs or 30 days in Queens County Magistrate's Court yesterday morning. Magistrate Gilbert A. Gaudet, Q. C., presided.

Additional cases on the docket were disposed of as follows: a resident of Charlottetown, one of Borden and a resident of Bradabane, all of whom were convicted of intoxication in a public place were each fined \$20 and costs or 20 days; and a party charged with leaving a vehicle unattended on the highway was fined five dollars and costs or five days.

In addition Magistrate Gaudet further remanded to February 26 the case of a Charlottetown resident charged with possession of intoxicating liquor not purchased on his permit, and dismissed charges of intoxication in a public place involving two Charlottetown residents.

Two cows owned by Cyril Jones of Pownal are listed with the top ten milk and fat producers on Plan B by the Holstein Friesian Association of Canada. They are Crown Point Posch Camay, a six year old which produced 20,607 lbs milk, 881 lbs. fat with a BCA milk of 158 and a BCA fat of 184.

Crown Point Posch Chieftain, a 10 year old owned by Cyril Jones produced 23,375 lbs of milk and 825 lbs fat. Her BCA for milk was 182 and for fat 183.

Miss Susie Abbecker owned by W. Buntain and Sons, Rustico in 13 lactation periods of 2X milkings has produced 210,420 lbs milk with 7,385 lbs fat. Susie has been awarded a gold ribbon for her performance.

Miss Susie Abbecker Pontiac owned by W. R. Bovyver, Charlottetown R. R. has won a gold seal record by producing in nine lactation period 186,745 lbs milk, 7,088 lbs fat.

Silver seal record go the Malpeque Model Korndyke Bell owned by Bunbury Farms who in 13 lactations produced 174,743 lbs milk, 6,748 lbs fat and to Willowfarm Daisy Queen owned by R. A. Proffitt who in 11 lactations produced 168,071 lbs. milk, 5,697 lbs. fat. Abegweit Decoy owned by Bunbury Farms in 11 lactations produced 163,356 lbs. milk, 6,959 lbs fat. Riverlea Jean Pontiac owned by G. S. Buntain in 11 lactations produced 155,564 lbs. milk, 5,925 lbs. fat.
