Von der Porten now made the key bid of three diamonds. He realized, both from the strong bidding by North-South and d Mathe's bid of two hearts, denoting limited values, that his adversary had the balance of power. He therefore bid diamonds to prepare the way for the best line of defense.
South now jumped to four hearts, and since he was in a contract, Mathe, obviously following orders, led a diamond. This was the beginning of a killing line of defense.
Von der Porten ruffed, a diamond, and then with a 4-1-1-1 hand, undered the A-K-Q to put Mathe in the lead. Mathe was the heart with the best and returned another diamond on East to ruff again.
This gave the defense their third trick. Von der Porten now played the queen of clubs, but he was hoping the declarer could do to make a contract.
He still had to lose a diamond to the king and go down a trick against the striking defense he had recognized.
Von der Porten was for South and it was made even more sure by the knowledge that five diamonds was cold against any defense.

OTTAWA (CP)—The unemployment insurance fund went into the hole by \$2,002,674 in April and is expected to head even deeper in May.

Drink Firm Faces Charge

The money was made available through a Governor-General's warrant approved by the cabinet before Parliament opened. The \$30,000,000 is on top of a \$25,000,000 loan made by the previous government in April, also through the device of a Governor-General's warrant.
The government loans must be paid off if and when the fund gets back in the black.
