Drugs Are Sent To Viet Cong

MONTREAL (CP)— The Soviet liner Alexander Pushkin has sailed carrying \$8,600 worth of Canadian medical supplies destined for treatment of Viet Cong wounded in Viet Nam as a gift from Canadian Quakers. The 300 pounds of bandages, scissors and drugs is to be sent "to the North Vietnamese Red Cross and to the Red Cross of the National Liberation Front (Viet Cong)," a press release from the Canadian Friends Service Committee said. The committee is sponsored by Canadian Quakers.
