Two men were arrested a short time later. Police said they were carrying bundles of bills and were not armed.

Police said Jacques Poillon, Montreal, and Robert Sanson, of no fixed address, will appear in court today on charges of armed robbery. Officers said that between \$2,000 and \$2,500 was recovered.

Mr. Picard said that three men, wearing dark glasses and handkerchiefs over their faces, entered the credit union shortly after he opened the office at noon. He said one of them fired a shot in the air while one of the men tied him up.
