"Is there anybody you know that you don't speak to?"

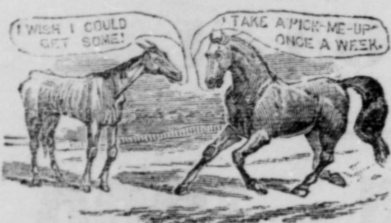

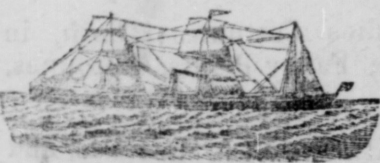
