

Fishery Bulletin.

(Fisheries Intelligence Bureau Report.) HALIFAX, July 27.—In Quebec cod are good at St John River, Long Point and Sheldrake; fair at Thunder River and Seven Islands; poor at Perce and Paspébiac; no fishing of any kind at Grand River or Newport Point. On the north coast of N. B. all fisheries are reported very poor. In P. E. I. a few mackerel are being taken along the north coast at the various ports from Miminigash down to Malpeque, but none are reported in the vicinity of Souris. The cod and lobster fishing are doing fairly well at Malpeque, the catches of the latter averaging 800 per boat, and hake and herring are very plentiful at Souris. In Cape Breton cod, hake, herring and mackerel are reported plentiful at Port Hood. The codfishery is also good off Ingonish, in deep water and at Arichat. Herring very good at Englishtown; struck in off Mira and Cow Bay, and fair catches are reported at North Synney, and Louisburg, Arichat and Port Hawkesbury, N. S. About two hundred herring per boat reported at White Head; a light catch of mackerel and shore cod at Lunenburg and a fair catch of cod at Liverpool and Digby. The hake and haddock are excellent and the herring fair. The fishery in the Bay of Fundy is reported remarkably good. The catch of squid fair at Ingonish, but irregular. Also, a few at Meat Cove, Englishtown, and Arichat, C. B.

ELECTION

UNDER provisions of an Act of the General Assembly of the Province of Prince Edward Island, made and passed in the fifty-ninth and sixtieth years of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter Ten, intitled "An Act to Amend the 'City of Charlottetown Incorporation Act,'" and to decide as to its adoption or otherwise.

In pursuance of the provisions of the above recited Act, I, the undersigned, Thomas Heath Haviland, Mayor of the said City of Charlottetown, do hereby give PUBLIC NOTICE that I have nominated and appointed

Wednesday, 12th day August next, A. D. 1891,

as the day for the PLEBISCITE VOTE to be taken upon the said Act, and that the same will be taken at the several places following, that is to say:— In Ward No. 1, at or near Fire Engine House on King Street, between Great George and Prince Streets. In Ward No. 2, at or near the house of the late Thomas Connolly, opposite H. Heath's Warehouse, Sidney Street, between Great George and Prince Streets. In Ward No. 3, at or near the Market House. In Ward No. 4, at or near the new City Hall, corner of Kent and Queen Streets. In Ward No. 5, at or near the carriage shop of Carroll & McAlor, corner of Euston and Great George Streets. And at the said Election the Poll will be opened at nine o'clock in the forenoon, and continue open until five o'clock in the afternoon of the same day.

DESCRIPTION OF WARDS. Number One shall comprise all that part of Charlottetown which lies south of Dorchester Street, and the parcel of land formerly known as the Military Barrack Ground. Number Two shall comprise all that part of Charlottetown which lies south of Richmond Street and north of Dorchester Street. Number Three shall comprise all that part of Charlottetown which lies south of Grafton Street and north of Richmond Street. Number Four shall comprise all that part of Charlottetown which lies south of Fitzroy Street and north of Grafton Street. Number Five shall comprise all that part of Charlottetown which lies north of Fitzroy Street, including the Common of the said Town.

QUALIFICATION OF ELECTORS. Sec. 19 of 54 and 55 Victoria, Chapter 10:— 14. "Any person entitled by law to vote for Mayor of the said City at the last Civic Election."

"15. "Or any person who shall have paid the tax which entitles him to vote at any time before he actually polls his vote under this Act."

MANNER OF VOTING. Sec. 11 of 54 and 55 Victoria, Chapter 10:— "Each Elector offering himself at his proper P. I. shall vote either 'FOR THE ACT' or 'AGAINST THE ACT,' and his name shall be written in the Poll Book under an appropriate head."
