Election Controversy Looms Over Promises

OTTAWA (CP) — For many years the late C. D. Howe was alleged to be the author of the remark "what's a million" in an off-hand reference to government spending. Now political observers on Parliament Hill are wondering whether the next election campaign will see Postmaster-General Nicholson, a Howe protégé, tagged with the label "what's a million?" The Hansard record of Commons proceedings last Tuesday

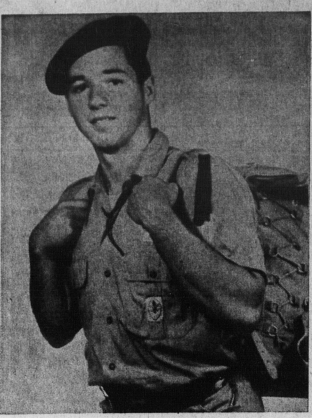
Mr. Nicholson, minister responsible for housing, was being questioned about an impending increase in veterans housing rentals in Vancouver. He also was being reminded of an election promise made by fellow Vancouverite, Northern Affairs Minister Laing, to hold the line on the rent. "There is a difference between a private person campaigning as a member of the Opposition trying to get elected, and a member of the government," Mr. Nicholson said. "When a man speaks during the course of an election campaign about what he will try to do that is another matter and different from speaking as a member of the government." Conservative strategists now are preparing this with the phrase "what's a million?"

Two Charges Withdrawn

Magistrate A.J. Haslam, QC, fined Herbert MacQuaid, Southport \$150 and costs or 30 days when the accused, charged with drunken driving, pleaded guilty to the lesser charge of driving while impaired in city police court Saturday. A speeding charge against Barry K. Murphy of Southport drew a fine of \$15 and costs or five days. A charge of joyriding against Barry William Doyle of Charlottetown, and one of leaving the scene of an accident against Daniel Morris of Charlottetown, were withdrawn. A fine of \$50 and costs was imposed on Willard Kennedy, trailer court, Falconwood Road, for driving while his operator's licence was suspended. Three persons were each fined \$20 and costs for possession of liquor in place other than their residences.

But in a few days and months and years after, Mr. Howe was freely quoted as having said "what's a million?"

DEF RECALLS REMARK
Ten years and nine months after that original remark, John Diefenbaker, then a non-contest MP for Prince Albert in the Conservative ranks, remarked in debate: "I know my honorable friend (Mr. Howe) once said 'what's a million?'" "That is a fiction that has been plastered all across the country," Mr. Howe shot back. "I am saying it was said," Mr. Diefenbaker added. "We all heard it," said Donald Fleming, then the Conservative MP for Toronto-Eglinton. "It never was said," Mr. Howe maintained. "My honorable friend now has made a statement and I can pin him down on this statement. You find the exact page of Hansard where it said that and quote it, and I will resign my seat and go to the country."
