A NARROW ESCAPE.—Sunday afternoon about four o'clock a large plate glass window in the grocery store of L. C. Wortby was broken during the progress of a quarrel. It seems two lads about eighteen years of age engaged in a friendly bout to pass the time, but later on the affair took a more serious turn, with the result that one was hurled against the window, and although smashing the large glass himself, escaped uninjured.

BURGLARIES IN CITY.—Burglars are again at work in the city. Last Wednesday night the store of R. F. Maddigan was entered and a large quantity of goods, mostly cigarettes and tobacco were taken. Entrance was gained by forcing the front doors. The burglary is supposed to have occurred after midnight as there was a "whist party" in progress just next door at the Pastime Club, and some of those in attendance were frequently at the street door. One of the members stated on coming out, on one occasion he noticed lads standing in the doorway of Mr. Maddigan's store, one of them holding a handkerchief over his face. When noticed they immediately went up the street. It is thought from the quantity of goods taken that the burglars made two trips. On the same night the office of L. M. Poole and Co., Connolly's wharf was also entered. The cash drawer here was forced open, but luckily all cash had been removed previous to locking up. The intruders however, took a .28 calibre revolver. Mr. Poole stated there was nothing else interfered with. In the office was a \$300.00 adding machine and two expensive typewriters, but the visitors were evidently looking for cash. It is also reported that the office of C. Lyons and Co was entered the same night, but as the matter was not reported, this cannot be verified.


LIFE INSURANCE SERVICE
