Opening lead—nine of hearts. This hand was once played in a practice team of four match in Italy. West would have been better off if he had led his own long suit, clubs, but he elected to lead a heart, hoping to find his partner with more strength in hearts than West had in clubs. East took the jack with dummy, secured in the knowledge that if either defender had started with five hearts he would be employed. And so it was. East won the five of hearts, with the six but then had to lead a heart from his 10-4 into dummy's Q-7. It was a hand very well played by the declarer.
