Hydro Capacity Is Increased

OTTAWA (CP)—Canada's expanding hydro - electric industry in 1957 boosted its capacity by 1,501,560 horsepower to meet increasing demands for power, the northern affairs department said Monday.

The department's annual review of hydro-electric plant construction said the additional capacity in 1957 was second only to 1954 when a record 1,758,450 horsepower was added.

Development in the year boosted to 19,871,008 horsepower the total installed capacity of Canadian hydro-electric generating plants. However, this represents less than 28 per cent of Canada's hydro-electric power resources.

British Columbia led the provinces in 1957 in hydro-electric expansion, with new capacity of 607,500 horsepower. It also matched Quebec in the greatest increase in installed capacity in any one plant.

Ontario ranked third with an increase in capacity of 381,000 horsepower. Capacity in Alberta rose by 23,000 horsepower, Manitoba by 7,000, Nova Scotia by 4,490, the Yukon by 3,000 and Newfoundland by 1,220. There were no increases in hydro-electric power capacity in Saskatchewan, New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island.

U. S. Population 172,800,000

WASHINGTON (AP) — The United States started the new year with 3,000,000 more residents than a year ago.

The census bureau estimated the population at 172,800,000 at the start of 1957, and said the country is making a net gain of one person every 11 seconds.

Women outnumber men by about 1,500,000, the bureau reported.
