CONTRACT BRIDGE

QUIZ

You have the following hand, both sides vulnerable:
AKQ5 ♥KJ852 ♠7
1. You are the dealer. What do you bid?
2. Your right-hand opponent opens with One Diamond, which you double and your left-hand opponent bids Three Diamonds, which is followed by two passes. What would you bid?
3. You deal and bid One Heart and partner responds One Spade. What would you bid now?
4. You deal and bid One Heart and partner responds Two Clubs. When you then bid Three Spades, partner responds Three Diamonds. What would you bid now?
5. Your right-hand opponent opens the bidding in One Diamonds, which you double. Trumps will then be in hearts. Northrup What would you bid now?

Here are the answers:
1. One Heart. This is a suit type hand and the first aim is therefore to find the longest trump suit. The intention is to make spades next, and partner will then know that the hearts are longer than the spades, since they were bid first. In choosing the opening bid, length of suit generally takes precedence over strength of suit.
2. Double. This is still a take-out double, even though partner had the opportunity to bid and bid. The hand is much too

Unitedrive Pledged To Capture Strangler

BELMONT, Mass. (AP)—A group of police officials and prosecutors have pledged a united effort to capture the man wanted for the slaying of a woman in the Greater Boston area and urged the state to post a \$500 reward. The moves resulted from a two-hour meeting called by Attorney-General Edward Brooke Monday and that she had paid him \$600 for cleaning her house in preparation for a party. He insisted he had left her home a month or more before 4 o'clock her husband, Israel, discovered her body shortly after that time on his return home. Her left stocking was knotted around her neck. Her body was in a corner of the living housewife by strangling her in a room. Police said she had been molested sexually. There has been no public report by a medical examiner. Mrs. Goldberg was the ninth woman strangled in the Greater Boston area in 10 months.
