## MANITOBA SCHOOL QUESTION.

Main Points of the Pope's Manifesto.

Right of Manitoba to Separate Schools Undoubted.

AND MUST BE MAINTAINED.

Persuasive and Peaceful Means to be Adopted.

MONTREAL, Nov. 16.—The Star's London correspondent cables: "The Pope's utterance on the Laurier-Greenway Manitoba School Settlement will be promulgated on Wednesday of this week. In the meantime we learn, on unimpeachable authority, the points of His Holiness' decision.

The utterance deals very exhaustively with the facts of the case, tracing them in detail to support what is claimed as the undoubted rights of the Manitoba Roman Catholics to separate schools and showing, also, the alleged infringement of this right by the action of the Manitoba Legislature. The Pope declares that Catholics must not attend public schools, that they must, like Roman Catholics everywhere, loyally and obediently support their own school system, even where the state refuses to assist, and declares that no opportunity must be lost in asserting the claims of Roman Catholics to the full enjoyment of their constitutional rights. Still His Holiness advises the Manitoba Catholics not to be too grasping and aggressive, but persuasively and by all peaceful methods to impress the justice and fairness of their temporarily lost cause upon their fellow-citizen of other faiths, in the hope that eventually their full rights may be restored.

OTTAWA, Nov. 16.—Sir Oliver Mowat will be sworn in Lieutenant-Governor of Ontario, and Senator Mills Minister of Justice on Thursday next.

## INTERCOLONIAL RAILWAY.

A Vacancy to be Filled.

Conductor Trueman the Lucky Man.

MONCTON, Nov. 16.—The Moncton station-mastership vacant since the dismissal of A. Hillson, nearly a year ago, is to be filled on December 1st, it is said, by the appointment of Conductor Geo. H. Trueman, of St. John.

RESIGNATION OF A COUNTY JUDGE.

Sir Oliver To Fill the Vacancy.

OTTAWA, Nov. 16.—It is stated on good authority that Judge Ross, of the County of Carleton, has either resigned or will do so at once. This is said to be the result of an interview the Judge had with Sir Oliver Mowat on Saturday last. It is understood that Sir Oliver intends recommending city solicitor D. B. McTavish for the position before leaving office.

Another Vacancy in the Commons.

MONTREAL, Nov. 16.—Fabien Boisvert, Conservative member of parliament for Nicolet, is dead. Nicolet is a close constituency, Boisvert's majority being only 138.

LATEST NEWS BY WIRE AND MAIL

LONDON November 14.—Earl Cadogan, Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, at his annual harvest home entertainment upon his estate at Culford, near Bury St. Edmunds, made an important statement. Lord Cadogan, in replying to the toast of his health, said that no one could occupy the position of Lord-Lieutenant of Ireland without being impressed with the importance of the work which he had to perform and the absolute necessity which lay upon all who valued the interest of the empire to promote the welfare and prosperity of Ireland. He believed that at the present moment they were on the eve of carrying out important changes in the social administration of the country which would secure to her liberties similar to those which England had long enjoyed. These changes would give Ireland the privilege of local self-government, and he hoped they would have the effect, which they had already had in England, of elevating the people to a higher sense of the responsibilities which devolved upon them as citizens of this great empire.

LONDON, Nov. 15.—The Rome correspondent of the Daily Mail says: "A high officer informs me that the recent recall of Col. Schwartzkappen, military attaché of the German embassy at Paris, has vital significance. It was due to the direct intervention of Emperor William in order to lessen an increasingly dangerous situation, Col. Schwartzkappen being the person who negotiated the purchase of the secret documents which led to the condemnation of Capt. Dreyfus."

WARREN, Idaho, Nov. 14.—The mail carrier was held up here last night by a lone highwayman and ordered to cut open his mail sacks, which he did, and the robber took all of the registered mail and letters. There was about \$1,000 in cash.

LONDON, Nov. 15.—A despatch to the Times, from Rio Janeiro, says that President Morass has issued a decree establishing martial law for a period of 30 days.

MADRID, Nov. 14.—A great stir has been caused in police circles over the robbery of a jewelry shop, which occurred at Seville last night. The jewelers attendants, who were sleeping on the premises, woke this morning and found that the shop had been practically emptied of its stock during the night, and the jewelry valued at over \$100,000 having been taken by thieves while they slept.

CONSTANTINOPLE, Nov. 14.—The Russian embassy here has made an announcement to the Turkish government that if Turkey intends to apply part of the Greek war indemnity to an increase of the Turkish armaments, Russia desires to remind Turkey that the unpaid arrears of the Russo-Turkish war indemnity amounting to £1,300,000, will be demanded by Russia.
