# Ed Bailey Has Sights On League Batting Ch'ship

NEW YORK (AP)—Only two Cincinnati players have won National League batting championships in the past 30 seasons and both have been catchers. Ed Bailey, the Redlegs' current mask and mitt man, is hoping to become the third this year.

Bailey, a second string receiver at the outset of the season and a .262 hitter in the minors last year, has taken over the National League hitting lead with a 3.47 average. Figures include games through Sunday.

Diego of the PCL after batting .197 in 1954 and .205 in 21 games with the Redlegs in 1955, has succeeded Smokey Burgess as the Redlegs No. 1 catcher. The 25-year-old left-handed swinger collected seven hits in 22 at bats last week, with five of the safeties being home runs.

# Milwaukee Powers Way To Eleventh Straight Victory

PHILADELPHIA (AP)—Milwaukee Braves powered their way past Philadelphia Phillies for their 11th straight triumph, 8-5, Monday night on the booming bats of Eddie Mathews and Bobby Thomson.

The Phillies tied it up 5-5 in the bottom of the eighth with a ninth-inning rally that opened with a double by Johnny Logan followed by a pair of bunts back to back by pinchhitters Andy Pafko and Del Crandall, the latter on a squeeze play. Harvey Haddix had replaced starter Stu Miller and he walked the dangerous Mathews who had homered earlier only to have Thomson, who also homered, single in the third run of the inning.

DETROIT (AP)—Clint Courtney's two-run pinch homer in the eighth gave the Washington Senators a 5-3 victory over Detroit Monday and sent the Tigers reeling to their ninth straight defeat.
