MAIL COURIER'S RECORD—Mr. Harris Blakeney has been delivering mail to the box holders on Kensington Rural Route 2 for eighteen years, using a horse for motive power even though the route is 37 miles long, second longest in the province. Only extremely bad roads and weather causes Harris to miss the trip, and a vacation is a rarity in his life. 204.462 miles is a lot of travelling, but that is probably under estimating the mileage covered in 18 years on a 37 mile route, not only in Summer, but in Winter as well, when roads follow all sorts of devious courses. On a route of this length, the mail is so heavy that the driver often leaves the post office almost smothered in bags and boxes of letters, papers and parcels, and at Christmas time, a second sleigh is often found necessary. "Harris" as he is called by young and old, is efficient, obliging and cheerful, as well as a good horseman, keeping his horses always in good condition for the long trip. Boxholders on Rural Route 2 are indeed fortunate in their faithful courier, who delivers the mail, rain or shine, and always in the box, never in the gutter or in a snow bank, where mail has been known to find a resting place, on more than one rural route.—Bur.

Renovations At Hall Mfg. Co. Are Completed

Extensive renovations and alterations which have been under way at the property of the Hall Manufacturing and Cold Storage Co. Ltd., Summerside, for the past several months are now complete. Previously the office, cold storage plant and the mill were in three separate buildings. Now everything is under one roof.

The old office building has been done away with and there is now a large space in front of the building where customers can park their cars and it can also be used for displaying automobiles and farm machinery. The space between the cold storage and the mill has been built in to make one large building.

The portion of the cold storage used for storing fox feed has been done away with and in the southwest section of the building a new and more spacious office is now located. The office is finished in Donnacanna and the ceiling in Donnacanna squares. The cement floor will later be covered with rubber tile.

On the left of the entrance is the private office of the general manager, Mr. George Key. The color scheme is ivory and blue. The office is equipped with two large safes and above them is cupboard space for office supplies. There is also a staff wash-room.

Between the office and mill is a car and machinery showroom and garage with large windows opening towards the street. Upstairs is used for storing machinery and cars and these can be brought up by means of a ramp from the rear of the building just as they are taken from the railway cars. This section of the building is 80 by 78 feet.

Hall's are dealers for Kaiser-Fraser and Morris cars. The background of the showroom is unique. It is composed of a series of large screens painted green and these are movable so that the size and shape of the show space can be adjusted depending on the

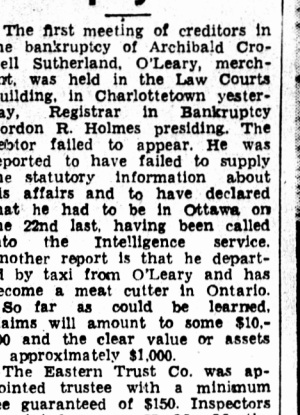

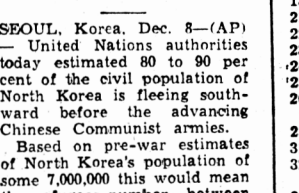
