BURLEY, England (AP)—Mrs. Sybil Leek—a real live witch and proud of it—has everything ready for Halloween, including her black cat.

"But I'm not riding any broom," she explained in a recent interview. "I'm walking on stilts as usual."

Then why the conjuring? "I'm taking it along—as I always do—because I'm a darned old up there in the fifties."

The witch and the other 12 members of her coven will build a fire under the cauldron and brew some soup from herbs to keep them warm on Halloween, this Thursday.

Asked what time the coven would meet she replied: "At midnight (Thursday night), of course. What other time would we have it, when until about dawn (Friday)." Mrs. Leek lives in the woods in a spooky stretch of dense woods in the County of Hampshire, 100 miles southeast of London.

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ROLLO BAY TCA Seeking Bilingual Stewardesses

MONTREAL (CP) — TCA plans to launch an extensive recruiting campaign for bilingual stewardesses within the next few weeks, a spokesman for the air line said today.

The campaign is to be waged mainly through newspaper, radio and television advertising. The spokesman said TCA estimates it will need 200 new stewardesses in the next few weeks. He said the airline has a large backlog of applicants.

The new recruits will be divided into three classes, one of 60 to start training March 16, one of 80 to start April 20 and a third of 50 to start May 25.

Of the approximately 700 stewardesses in service now, about 250 can speak both English and French.

Gov't Given Massive Power In Trusteeship

OTTAWA (CP) — The government may act as a government or as a signor in any legal action against the Seafarers' International Union of Canada for inciting an illegal strike.

As a government, it can invoke the powers set out in the Maritime Transportation Unions Trustees Act, taking over "control and management" of the SUIU by appointing three trustees in whom full authority is vested.

The Trusteeship Act, approved by Parliament and signed into law by the prime minister, gives the trustees massive powers to run the SUIU and four other Great Lakes labor unions.

The government could act on behalf of the NHB under the provisions of the Canada Shipping Act dealing with desertion or being absent without leave. Under the act, a ship's master, mate or other may "convict" deserters back to their ships with or without the help of local police. The seaman can refuse to go and demand that he be taken before "some court capable of taking cognizance of the matter to be dealt with according to law."

If convicted of desertion a seaman is liable to jail terms up to three months. The penalties for being AWOL are forfeiture of pay—although a full term may be imposed if the offence takes place outside Canada.
