### NOTES AND COMMENTS.

—The Governor General and Lady Minto are at Halifax. Are they not coming to Charlottetown?

—Hon. Mr. Fielding has found it necessary to make another "temporary" loan of a quarter of a million pounds sterling in Great Britain, raising that liability from \$2,433,343 on 30th June to \$3,863,333 on 31st July.

—The Montreal Gazette says that if there is not dissolution announced before this time next year, at the farthest, it will be because Messrs Tarte, Sifton and Blair have concluded that the Government party has most to hope from staying off an appeal on the record they have made.

—A story is told in Mainzly about People, regarding the Duke of Connaught's son, young Prince Arthur, who was overjoyed at the fact that he had got out of the Sax Cobourg succession. He was sent over to inspect his possessions, and on returning to Eton he confided to his schoolfellows that what finally decided him to "chuck it" was his being asked to play tennis with three other German princes, and finding they had balls fielded for them by a squad of soldiers, who saluted at attention each time they had handed the ball. This was too much for the English schoolboy, he explained, so he promptly decided to remain English.

—Le Soleil, of Quebec, had a two column article on Saturday on the general elections in which it declares that it sees no state reasons for making an appeal to the public. It warns the Government not to be deceived by the idea that the Conservatives are unprepared, as such idea may prove an illusion. Going on the Liberal organ tries to mask the fact that a large number of Liberals are only waiting for an opportunity to down the Laurier Government for its complete neglect of its ante-election promises by warning them that hundreds of their partisans who worked like lions during the struggle of 1896 would stand aloof. The reason for this action, according to Le Soleil is because the federal Government has failed in its promise to reform the civil service.

—French colonization in Africa has not been fortunate. Lately a very unfortunate affair occurred, in which one French expedition killed a number of the members of another French party. The killing occurred on July 14, the date of the French National fete. It appears that on news being received of the barbarity of the Voulet Chanine mission towards the natives in the march towards Chad, the Dupuy ministry instructed Lieutenant-Colonel Klobb, who was at Kaiyes, to proceed with the flying column, overtake the mission, investigate the charges, and assume command on July 14. The Klobb party overtook the mission at Zimber, near Domanger, Lieut. Col. Klobb sent word to Captain Voulet, who replied that he would shoot him if he advanced. Not understanding this threat Klobb advanced and made himself known to Voulet, who ordered him peremptorily to stop. The order was disregarded and when the Klobb party was a hundred and fifty metres from Voulet's troops the latter on his order, fired three volleys which were followed by independent firing. Lieut. Mienner fell dead. Lieutenant-Colonel Klobb was injured in the leg by the first volley, and despatched by being shot in the head. Voulet then ordered a bayonet charge and the remainder of the Klobb column fled, carrying their wounded and leaving besides the two officers nine dead. The survivors, ten of whom were wounded, reached Desse, under the command of a native sergeant.

### THE SENATE.

The Monetary Times remarks that "on the whole, the Government acted wisely in withdrawing the Senate Amendment Bill, which might more properly be called the Senate Suppression Bill. The world as actually governed, is far from having reached the conclusion that second Chambers are unnecessary, undesirable, or useless. The consensus of opinion everywhere, or with so few exceptions that they scarcely count in the aggregate, is in favor of second Chambers. And what is their proper function? Not to be mere echoes of the other branch of the Legislature; but to express the sober, second thought of the community, in the form of revising and occasionally rejecting measures hastily put together, the defects which become more apparent under prolonged discussion. It would perhaps be better if all second Chambers were, in some form, representative bodies; but where they owe their existence to selection, in the form of executive nomination, it would never be tolerated, in a Democratic country like ours, that they should persevere in rejecting a measure after it has received the endorsement of the electorate, in an election in which it formed a distinct issue, after the first rejection. Where there is a representative Chamber, and a nominated Chamber, the former is apt to be aggressive, which is indeed natural, for the presumption that its mandate is clearer and more certain than that of the nominated Chamber. Nevertheless the latter has its rights and its duties, as well as the other Chamber. Senate reform is one thing, Senate suppression, on critical occasions, by submerging it in the other Chamber, instead of bringing reform, would give to the other Chamber that unchecked sway which the wisest men of all countries have, with rare exceptions, deprecated as a public calamity.

### French Shore Question.

St. JOHN'S, Nfld., August 22.—The Colonial Government has been informed by the Imperial Secretary of State for the Colonies, Joseph Chamberlain, that negotiations for the settlement of the French shore dispute are progressing between Great Britain and France, and that he is hopeful of a speedy and satisfactory arrangement. It is believed that matters are going well because the French warships are to withdraw from the coast at the close of August, two months earlier than usual.

### Triple Execution at Dawson.

SEATTLE, Wash., August 22.—Passengers on the City of Topeka, which arrived last night from Skagway, Alaska, bring news of the first legal execution in the Klondyke. A triple hanging occurred at Dawson on August 4th. The parties hanged were two Indians, Dawson Nontuck and James Nontuck, and one white man, Edward Henderson. Henderson was convicted of murdering his partner, named Peterson, on the trail near Marsh Lake, in September, 1897. The Indians were convicted of murdering William Mahan and injuring his partner, James Foss, on the Aclacook river, in May, 1898.
