Island Trout Pond Listed In Trade News As Anglers' Delight

OTTAWA, (CP)—There's a 23-acre trout pond in Prince Edward Island from which anglers have been taking two fish per rod-hour for the last 11 years. The story of this happy hunting ground for anglers is related in the most recent issue of Trade News, published by the federal fisheries department. The pond is on the North Montague river. It is fed by a stream draining an area of about 25 square miles. The stream is spring-fed—this is characteristic for P. E. I.—which makes it highly productive of trout food. A resident at the pond—the publication does not give his name—has kept a creel-census of the number of speckled trout taken from the pond in the last 11 years, number of anglers and their time spent fishing. Number of trout taken per rod-hour was 24 in April, 23 in May, two in June, 17 in July, 18 in August and 21 in September. Angling success is lowest when water temperatures are highest. The angling season runs from April 15 to Sept. 15.

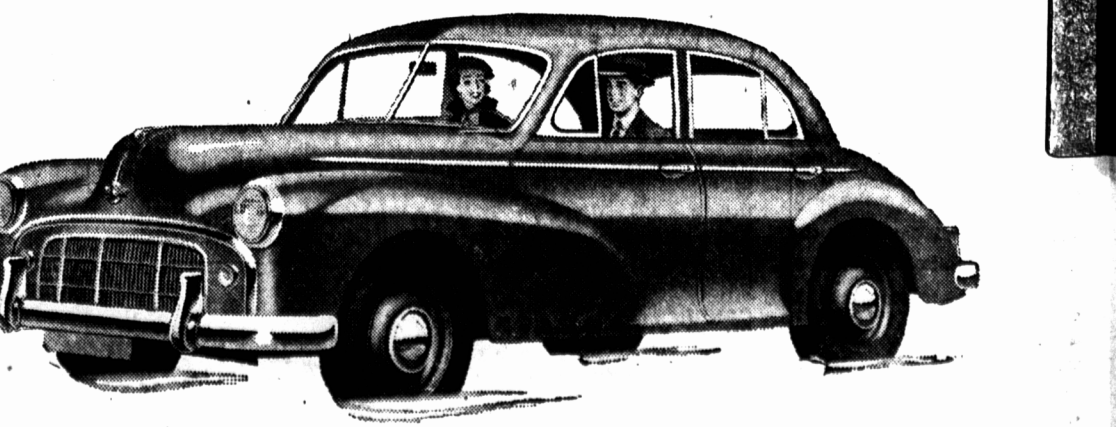
