The three-page poem by John G. Whittier, which will appear in the November St. Nicholas Magazine, commemorates the visit of a party of young girls to the poet's home. It contains the following lines, which have a peculiar significance now that the good Quaker poet has passed away:

"I would not if I could repeat
A life which still is good and sweet;
I keep in age, as in my prime,
A not uncheerful step with time,
And, grateful for all blessings sent,
I go the common way, content
To make no new experiment.
On easy terms with law and fate,
For what must be I calmly wait,
And trust the path I cannot see,
That God is good sufficient me.
And when at last upon life's play
The curtain falls, I only pray
That hope may lose itself in truth,
And age in Heaven's immortal youth,
And all our loves and longings prove
The foretaste of diviner love!"

THE BIBLE AND SCIENCE.—The Century Magazine will take up the Bible and Science controversy. In the November Century, Professor W. Shields, of Princeton, answers the question "Does the Bible contain Scientific errors?" with an emphatic no. He says: "Literary and textual obscurities there may be upon the surface of Holy Writ, like spots upon the sun, or rather like notes in the eye; but scientific error in its divine purport would be the sun itself extinguished at noon. Such a Bible could not live in this epoch."
Professor Shields' article will be followed by one in the December Century on "The Effect of Scientific Study upon Religious Beliefs."

Competitive Examinations.

(The Empire.)

There are some significant comments upon the present competitive examination of the current number of The Canada Educational Monthly, which excellent publication, by the way, presents at the same time a variety of opinions from different sources on the question. We should be inclined to think that the Monthly is rather sceptical of the competitive system as now carried on, though its own comments are guarded, intelligent and discreet. What makes the subject of special interest is that the recommendation of the Royal Commission on civil service reform, favouring the application of the written competitive system to appointments and promotions in the service is not before the Government. Possibly the question may come up for discussion in Parliament next session. In any event Parliament ought to weigh well the consequences before turning the whole service loose into the examination hall. The Commission, it is true, exempted certain of the higher officials from the operation of the rule, being apparently of opinion that a government might be capable enough of appointing a deputy-minister, but would break down over the choice of a first-class clerk. To some minds it will seem as if the homely proverb applies here, that what is good for the goose is good for the gander. If competitive examination is bad for the system of a deputy, the chances are it will disagree with other important officials in the service. A deputy minister is no doubt a very great personage, if whom we desire to speak in terms of the utmost humility and awe, but he is a human being like the rest of us. Perhaps the politicians would like to get rid completely of civil service patronage, which is often vexatious and never satisfactory. If so, let us frankly know it. We trust that the subject will get a thorough airing in Parliament before legislation is attempted, for whatever part competitive examination is to play in any reforms that may be instituted, the experience of our educators with the system ought to be given great weight. It is sometimes said that the worst that could befall would be to fill up the civil service with prigs. A prig often makes a very capable and intelligent official, but there is not only no guarantee that competitive examinations would stop at prigs, but the chances are hugely in favor of the production of incompetents. If we have reached a point where Government of all kinds, federal and provincial, is held to be unfit to be entrusted with appointments to office, the general public will be surprised to know it. There need be no hesitation in making examinations a test of fitness for certain duties, but that it should be by all and end all of filling vacancies in the public service is a serious proposition that cannot be admitted without question.

North West Territory Notes

We are now enjoying our most delightful season in the North West Territories. The weather is beautiful, warm, sunny and calm.

All rains and winds are unknown here; so that once the summer heat and mosquitoes are gone there are a few months when it is a veritable paradise for farmers, and for them especially, and even poets might find much inspiration in our splendid valleys, for, as a gentleman who expected to find a pretty level road in a prairie country remarked: "If there are no hills here, there are some tremendous hollows to get over," and just now, since our Canadian artist, Frost, who knows so well how to bring out tints, has performed his annual painting, they present a gorgeous appearance, recalling to mind the lines in a North Western writer's poem on becoming a better Christian,—

"What did I see? what oft before
Rested my gaze upon;
Our own dear prairie valley,
Lit by the morning sun."

"Those soft green hills, that shining lake,
So beautiful and bright,
Seemed symbols of the Maker's love,
While the vastness spoke of might."

The lakes are now the resort of thousands of wild ducks and geese. Pairs of chickens abound everywhere, supplying plenty of game for sportsmen.

The crops are such that farmers can aim to be known by the serenity of their smile, as they calculate how many thousand bushels of No. 1 hard they are going to have.

Threshing is going on rapidly, with good returns of a first-class grade of wheat. There has been no damage done by frost this year, so that the crop, though not so heavy as last year, will still leave more good wheat in the country,—but the price is low, only 50 cents, with not much prospect of anything better as yet. Hay is plentiful.

Ranchers are moving back from this district. It is twenty miles to the C. P. R. from here, and the land is all being taken up, leaving them not enough for pasture and hay.

The municipality has given a bonus to a railway to be run about a hundred miles north to a coal field out there, and to connect with the C. P. R. near Regina. It is to be completed next summer.

The latest boom—and it is a big one—is the new coal town of Estevan. The coal is of good quality, and plenty of it.

Everyone, young and old, is busy getting ready something for the municipal exhibition on the 7th. The interest taken augurs well for the future of the stock, grain, vegetables, and handicraft of the people of Assiniboia.

News Notes.

Three million pounds of fish were caught in Lake Winnipeg the past season.

There are said to be 5,000 professional drivers of trotting horses in the United States.

Thirty-eight new cases and sixteen deaths from cholera were reported in Buda-Pesth on Monday.

In Manitoba there are four settlements of an industrious, thrifty people, who live apart from the outer settlers and have a language and a life peculiar to themselves. These are the Mennonites, a religious sect founded in the sixteenth century by a Hollander, and a fellow worker in the reformation with Luther, but who separated from him on the doctrines of infant baptism, bearing arms and taking oaths. Gathering a few followers around him, the Hollander taught that baptism should not be administered until a change of heart had been experienced, and that true believers should not swear, but affirm, should not bear arms or go to law.
