Debt Is \$685 Per Head Now

OTTAWA (CP)—The net debt of the federal government was an estimated \$11,685,800,000 at March 31—roughly \$685 for each of the 17,340,000 people in Canada.

The pre-budget white paper, tabled in the Commons today by Finance Minister Fleming, showed the net debt rose \$639,500,000 during the 1958-59 fiscal year.

Loans Switched To The Far East

OTTAWA (CP)—The Canadian government has been building up its foreign loans in the Far East as Western countries pay off post-war debts to Canada.

Insurance Fund Is Lower Today

OTTAWA (CP)—Heavy demands by jobless have driven the unemployment insurance fund down to \$512,600,000, the government reported today.

Pension Fund Is In The Red

OTTAWA (CP)—The old age pension fund went into the red by \$184,000,000 in the fiscal year just ended—an all-time high.

Defence Account Used In Full

OTTAWA (CP)—Finance Minister Fleming's deficit in the last fiscal year would have been \$28,400,000 instead of \$616,600,000 if he had not drawn every last dollar out of a special defence account.

ACCOUNT LIQUIDATED

The special account, which has existed for several years, was a bookkeeping device whose balance had been built up before 1956 by crediting to it the estimated value of equipment and supplies given to NATO partners under mutual aid.

Canadian Living Costs Showed Decline In 1958

OTTAWA (CP)—Canadian living standards underwent a slight decline in 1958, Parliament was informed today.

Exports Decline

A lot of key exports, such as newsprint and metals, declined. Interest rates increased. Bond prices fell.

Higher Savings

Amid the unemployment problem, Canadians generally were able to spend more and still save more. Total consumer spending increased to \$20,713,000,000 from \$19,768,000,000 in 1957.

Employment Began To Pick Up

Average annual wages rose by \$61 to \$3,534, up 1.8 per cent, compared with a rise of \$132 or four per cent in 1957. However, living costs increased by 2.6 per cent.

Services Get Less

Budgetary spending on the armed services themselves dropped by \$229,200,000 to \$1,172,200,000. The outlay for army services was \$370,100,000, for naval services \$208,800,000, and for air services \$593,300,000.

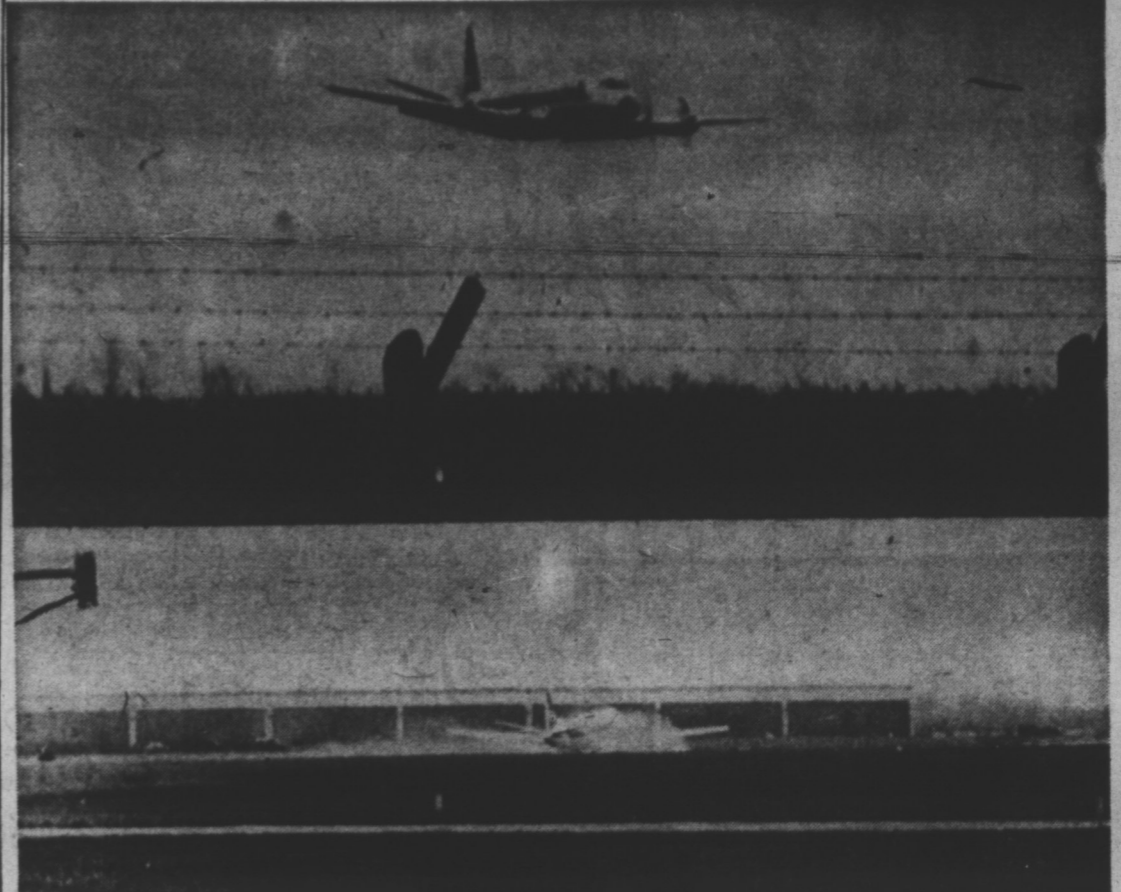

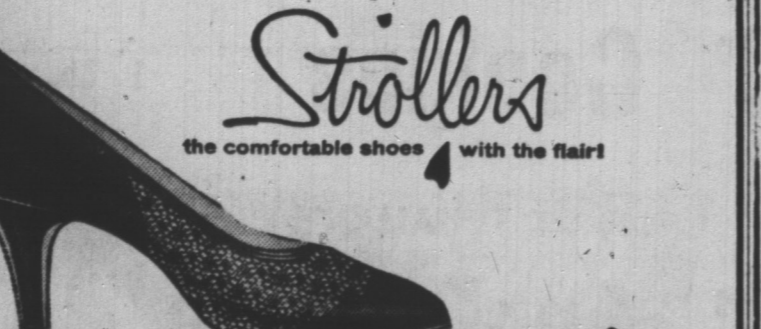
