**Victoria Man  
Is President**

TORONTO (CP) — Stuart Keate, publisher of Victoria Times, was elected president of The Canadian Press Tuesday.

He succeeds A. F. Mercier of Quebec. Le Soleil and L'Evening president for the last two years.

Mr. Mercier was elected honorary president. St. Clair Balfour of Winnipeg Tribune first vice-president and R. A. Graybe of Windsor Star second vice-president.

The Canadian Press is the co-operative through which Canadian daily newspapers exchange the news of their areas and bring in and distribute the news of the world. CP also provides news to most Canadian radio and television stations.

Mr. Keate started newspaper work in 1923 when he was 20, as University of British Columbia correspondent for Vancouver papers. From UBC he joined Vancouver Province as golf columnist and sport writer and later worked on general news for The Province and Toronto Star.

**WAS NAVY OFFICER**  
He was a navy information officer in Atlantic and Pacific theatres during the war, attaining rank of lieutenant commander.

Then he joined Time Inc. at New York as a writer on Canadian affairs, and later moved in Montreal as chief of bureau for Time and Life Magazines. In 1950 he resigned to return to the Pacific Coast as publisher of Victoria Times and vice-president of Victoria Press Limited which operates the evening Times and morning Victoria Colonist.

Victoria Press now is part of FP Publications Limited and Mr. Keate is a director of the parent firm.

He was president of Canadian Daily Newspaper Publishers Association in 1962-63 and is a member of the Canada Council and of the board of governors of UBC.

Officers were chosen by the board of directors after the annual general meeting of members at which Mr. Mercier reported on CP's operating position and Gilles Purcell, general manager, on details of the service.

**U.S. Power  
Under Fire**

WASHINGTON (AP) — Pentagon policies and presidential politics boiled up a storm of debate over U.S. military might Tuesday, and the defence department said the United States holds an increasing margin of superiority over the Soviet Union.

Questions have been raised regarding the magnitude of our superiority and whether it is continuing to grow. The Pentagon said in an unusual statement that made public hitherto classified facts on U.S. and Soviet bombers and missiles.

"The fact is it has been increasing and we intend that it shall continue to increase," the statement said.

It came a few hours after publication of congressional testimony in which Gen. Curtis E. LeMay, air force chief of staff, said he thinks the Soviet Union has narrowed the gap of U.S. superiority.

While it clearly was prompted by LeMay's comments, Pentagon spokesman said the statement was in reply to a number of charges about U.S. defence policies, including statements by Senator Barry Goldwater.

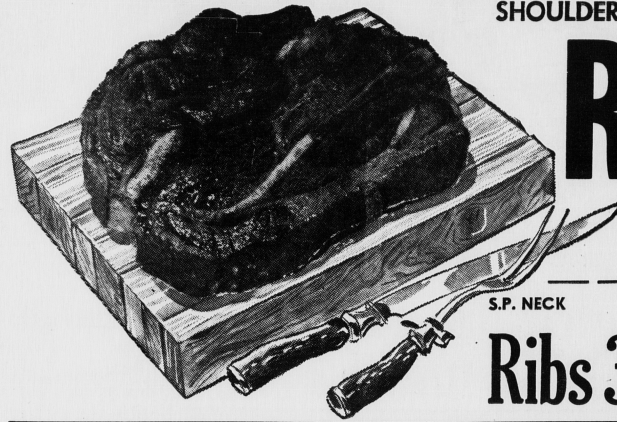
