

THE CITY SCHOOLS. Midsummer Examinations. UPPER PRINCE STREET SCHOOL.

The first of the series of public examinations and scholastic exhibitions took place in Upper Prince Street School to-day. This school is growing and prospering. There are now on the roll the names of six hundred and fifty children, the daily average attendance being upwards of five hundred. The teachers number eleven. Every room in the large school building is occupied.

Certainly, the sight of so many children, clean, healthy and happy, was in the highest degree pleasing. The competitors for reading in the rooms of Principal Seaman and Miss McKinnon, in which L. H. Davies, M. P., was judge, were perhaps the most interesting features of the examination. The results appear in the prize list. The entertainment in the upper hall was very pleasing from beginning to end. Though the hall was uncomfortably crowded, and many could not obtain seats, everyone seemed to enjoy the vocal and instrumental music and the recitations. We regret that the space of THE EXAMINER will not admit of a fuller report concerning this excellent school.

The thanks of the scholars and spectators were, on motion of his Worship Mayor Haviland, unanimously voted to the staff of teachers. Principal Seaman replied briefly.
