Unique Situations As Service Personnel Vote

OTTAWA, (CP)—Voting by Canadian servicemen and women in the federal election is producing some unique situations. Some voted aboard a German train. Others cast their ballots in Florida.

It's all legal, no matter where the 105,000 eligible members of the armed forces are serving. Polls remain open three hours daily until Saturday. The ballots then are collected at Edmonton, Ottawa, Halifax, Kure, Japan and London, England, for counting. The result will be announced here Monday, Aug. 17, a week after Canada's voting date.

The men who voted on the German train were a group of 50, commanded by Maj. A. S. Ennis-Smith of Ottawa, homeward bound. Their train was between Hannover, where the 27th infantry brigade is stationed, and the port of Bremerhaven.

Because their boat was due to sail the night of Aug. 3—first day of the service vote—and would not reach a Canadian port until after the election, the poll was set up on one of the train coaches.

The votes cast were taken off the train at Bremerhaven for mailing to London.

The hardships of voting abroad were duplicated in many parts of Europe. Tents, trucks and barracks provided polling booths for other members of the 27th brigade. Troops in hospitals or attached to embassies and British formations will be visited by a deputy returning officer.

The men who voted in Florida were aboard the destroyer escort Algonquin, at Key West for trials. Their ballots will be flown to Canada.

More than 800 navy men serving on the destroyers Iroquois, Athabaskan and Huron in the Korean theatre will vote either in Japan or at sea. If they vote at sea, the ballots will be flown by helicopter to Kure.

Vote In Far North

The navy also has men at the Akivik radio station, 125 miles inside the Arctic circle on the Mackenzie river in the Northwest Territories. They probably will be the most northerly voters in the navy. Some air force personnel likely will vote at stations further north.

Cocktail Lounges For Vancouver Expected

VANCOUVER, (CP)—The Vancouver News Herald says in a newspaper story Thursday that Vancouver is expected to have cocktail lounges by Christmas.

The newspaper said legislation authorizing establishment of the new liquor outlets will be introduced at the fall session of the British Columbia legislature opening Sept. 15.

The Social Credit government of Premier W.A.C. Bennett announced plans for changes in the province's liquor laws to allow establishment of

during the voting period. Their ballots will be taken by automobile to Halifax. Most of the cruiser Ontario's men will vote in Bermuda. Those who fail to vote then will vote at sea and the ballots will be flown from Balboa in the Panama canal zone to Halifax.

On Canada's west coast, training ships are in port and no special arrangements to get the ballots to Edmonton, farthest-west voting headquarters, will be necessary.

But the frigates Swansea and La Hulloise are on training cruises in the Gulf of St. Lawrence off the east coast. Their ballots will be landed at Gaspé or Sept Iles, Que., and will go by mail to Ottawa.

Voting In Korea

In Korea some 7,000 members of the 25th brigade started voting Monday. They were joined by four RCAF jet pilots attached to the United States Air Force, who went by jeep to the Commonwealth medical unit at Seoul to vote. One was Sqdn. Ldr. Doug Warren of Edmonton.

About 3,500 RCAF men and women in the United Kingdom and Europe are eligible to vote. The overseas voter is given a ballot which he marks in secret and seals in an envelope. This is enclosed in another envelope and mailed airtight or sent by some other means to the returning officers at London or Kure.

Similar steps are taken with the ballots of men nearer to voting headquarters at Edmonton, Ottawa and Halifax.

Establishing Navy Reserve Air Arm

OTTAWA (CP)—A Canadian Navy reserve air arm, first in Canada's senior service history, is being established, naval headquarters said Tuesday night.

A reserve unit has already been established at Toronto and a second is planned for Kingston, Ont. "The project is still on an exploratory basis," a navy spokesman said. It was not yet known when actual flying would start or how many men would be involved. Pilots would train in single engine Harvards, then probably graduate to more advanced types of aircraft and fly with permanent force naval pilots for a few weeks.
