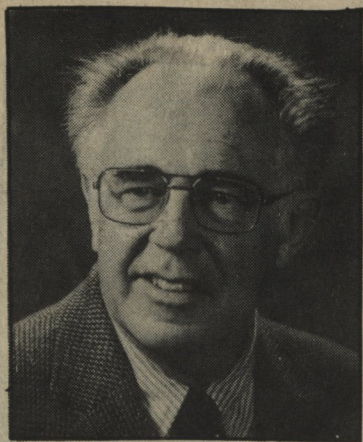


Message from the President

ought to be new questions on your mind, but UPEI will have succeeded if, when you leave us, you have that confidence and the knowledge to find your own answers.

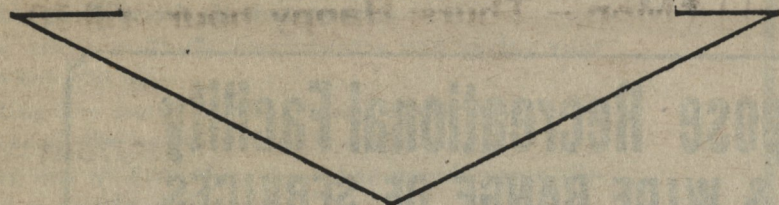
To each and every one of you, my personal good wishes that your stay here will both be rewarding and happy. Enjoy yourselves!
