**Contract Bridge**

**CHEAP INSURANCE**

Safety plays are not always complicated devices—sometimes they may be simple finesses! For example:

East dealer:  
Both sides vulnerable!

AK98	5
KC10	AJ98
Q	752
AK95	

The bidding:  
East: South West North  
1♥ Pass Pass Double  
Pass 1♣ Pass 3♣  
Pass 4♣ (final bid)

South's four-spade bid may look like a "stretch" but it was not. North, after showing the strength for a vulnerable takeout double, jumped South's forced response to three spades and thereby said in effect: "Go to game if you have anything better than a 'bid'." Since South did in fact have a five-card suit, whereas he might have had only a four-card suit, and since he had diamond honors which might be of value, he properly accepted the "urge."

West opened his top heart, dummy's queen was played, and East, reading the lead correctly, held out the ace and simply played the encouraging nine-spot. South cashed the ace king of trumps, only to see East show out. South tried to save himself by running diamonds, hoping to discard a heart, but long before he could do so, West ruffed in with the spade queen, and his second queen, and his second heart, gave East two tricks in the suit. A club trick defeated the contract.

South had two complaints against his "luck" in this deal. First (he said), since he had nine trumps in the combined hands, "probabilities" favored the drop of the queen; and second, since East had bid, West had not even held the bidding open, there was a substantially better chance that East had the spade queen.

Neither of these points was pertinent! The crucial feature was that West had to be kept out of the lead, so that he couldn't send another heart through dummy's king-ten. Thus, after cashing only one top trump, South should have entered his hand with a diamond and finessed for the spade queen, simply as a safety play! What could East do if he won this trick?
