New York Stocks

NEW YORK, (AP)—The stock market broke out of its narrow range last week with the strongest advance of the year. The rally Wednesday was hailed as the possible forerunner of the traditional summer rally. By the end of the week, however, some of the earlier enthusiasm had waned.

Nevertheless, a general air of optimism surrounded the stock market. On the week The Associated Press average was up \$1.20, the fourth straight weekly advance. The daily average volume at 1,367,000 shares also was the best of the past four weeks.

All of the ten more active issues of the week advanced, and in the 20 most active issues only two declined on the New York stock exchange.

Active issues on the New York stock exchange last week were New York Central up 1/4, at 23 1/2 with 150,400 shares traded and American Can and Foundry up 1/4 at 48.

Canadian issues closed the week mixed. Distillers Seagram and International Nickel were both off 1/4. Hiram Walker added 1/4, and Dome Mines was ahead 1/4.

Royalite oil slipped 1/4 on the American stock exchange.

U. S. Steel Report

CLEVELAND, (AP)—Automobile manufacturers still demand more steel than they can get although their assembly lines have been rolling faster than cars can be sold. Steel magazine says.

Indicating current strikes would not cause a car shortage quickly, the metal-working journal says dealers' inventories "have been creeping up about one car a month."

"On May 1," says the magazine, the inventories averaged 12.8 cars per dealer. A year earlier the figure was 7.7."

Steel said that household appliances also were being produced faster than they could be sold. Here, too, manufacturers are still demanding more steel.

United States mills operated last week at 100 per cent of their rated capacity, drop of one-half a point.
