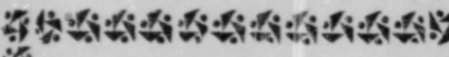

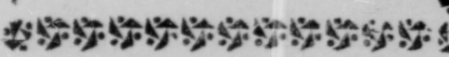

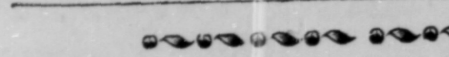

Local and Other Items.

LOTS OF INSURANCE.—Ex-mayor Vanwart, of Fredericton had a life insurance of \$101,000, of which \$51,000 goes to his widow.

HOTEL CHANGES HANDS.—The Sydney hotel at Sydney, Cape Breton, has been sold for \$31,000. It cost \$40,000 but was sold a few years ago for \$18,000.

HAS THREE LEGS.—J. W. Snowdon, of this town, has in his possession a chicken which is somewhat of a curiosity. Instead of possessing a pair of legs as do all ordinary chickens, this fowl has three. The superfluous member comes out of its back near where the tail ought to be. It is perfectly formed with the exception that it has but two toes. Otherwise the chicken does not differ from the ordinary run.—Sackville Post.

DEWEY AFTER MONEY.—The hero of the American-Spanish war, Admiral Dewey, has filed in the United States courts a claim to recover the prize money due him and officers and crew of his fleet for the vessel sunk in the battle of Manila, and the property subsequently recovered by the naval force under his command. Upon the ships and equipments which have already been appraised and inventoried by the board of appraisers, appointed by the Secretary of the Navy. Dewey demands the sum of \$355,141, and in addition the amount due upon the three cruisers sunk in the engagement, but subsequently raised, and upon which he places a value of \$125,000.

BURNED TO DEATH.—On Tuesday last, says the Sackville Post a little girl 5 years old, daughter of one of the men working in Doyle's mill, Rosebank, near Chatham, was burned to death. It appears that the child's mother went to Douglas-town shopping, leaving the little one and a younger child at home, thinking that they would be safe until her return. A short search resulted in the discovery of the child's body, horribly burned, between the house and the shore. It is thought that she had attempted to imitate her elders in the use of the lamp to curl her hair and by some means set fire to her hair or clothing, and endeavouring to reach the river to quench the flames met her awful fate.

China and Japan.

LONDON, August 10.—The Rome correspondent of the Daily Mail says the Italian Government has received positive confirmation of the report that China and Japan have concluded an alliance.

Drank Wood Alcohol.

ELMIRA, N. Y., August 10.—Four young men in Elkland, Tioga county, Pa., died suddenly within 24 hours. All were similarly affected previous to death. It is thought that they all drank wood alcohol at a picnic on Sunday. Several others are seriously ill, and two are expected to die.
