**Acheson Urges Support Of Foreign-Aid Program**

WASHINGTON, Mar. 1—(AP)—State Secretary Dean Acheson said last night that the North Atlantic Allies have taken "giant strides" toward becoming a "bastion of world peace. He urged "utmost support" from the American people for a continued foreign-aid program.

"The days of danger are still with us," Acheson said. "The forces which will be available in Europe by the end of this year are not the total forces required to assure the maintenance of peace. This is true even when the productive power of the United States and our airpower is added."

In a broadcast and televised address, Acheson reported to the North Atlantic Treaty Organization meetings at Lisbon.

Appealing for support of President Truman's forthcoming request to Congress for \$7,900,000,000 in new foreign-aid funds, he said U.S. assistance "is playing a vital part in the structure of strength which is being built in Europe."

Although he praised the agreements reached at Lisbon as contributions to growing free power against the threat of Communist aggression, Acheson cautioned that much work remains to be done.

"But free men will accomplish by peaceful means what tyrants have never been able to do," he said, "and in so doing, they will demonstrate the creative energy and power of freedom which will continue to flourish long after tyrannies have been forgotten."

Acheson said the decisions taken for setting up a six-country European defence community, with West Germany as an ally, "have brought us to the dawn of a new day in Europe." But he added: "These are not completed actions."

He listed as accomplishments at Lisbon:

"First, agreement was reached on the forces to be made available to General Eisenhower's N. A.T.O. command during this calendar year;

"Second, agreement was reached approving the creation of a European army by six nations, including West Germany;

"Fourth, agreement was reached by which the return of West Germany to a place of equality and responsibility in the European community can be achieved."

"And fifth, N.A.T.O. itself was reorganized and greatly strengthened."

They had 4,279 in 1930 and 11,672 in 1950.

**Population Vs. Church Membership**

TORONTO, March 1—British Columbia has had the largest increase in population of any province in Canada in the past year, Rev. W. G. Berry, Associate Secretary of the Board of Evangelism and Social Service of the United Church of Canada told the annual meeting of his Board held at the Wesley Buildings, Toronto, today.

The British Columbia increase is 42.47 per cent. Quebec and Ontario show a 21 per cent increase each.

Mr. Berry said that Alberta had shown the largest increase in membership in the United Church of Canada with a 20 per cent increase. The next two provinces were Quebec and British Columbia each with an 18 per cent increase.

Mr. Berry said that the provinces in which United Church membership has kept pace with population increases are rural rather than urban provinces. He wondered why the United Church was attracting the agricultural groups rather than the industrial groups.

The United Church should be seriously concerned about its small membership increase in comparison with the population in B. C., Ontario, Quebec and Newfoundland, Mr. Berry said.

Most United Churches keep on their membership rolls families who are non-resident, that is who do not live in the district and who do not attend the Church.
