THE HAGUE, June 27.—All through the Hague conference has thus far succeeded in establishing a record for dullness, it is expected there will be some living up today when the vanguard of the always uncertain and diverting Bolsheviks arrive from Russia. Litvinoff and Sokolnikoff and a few of their secretaries are scheduled to arrive first the others following in the course of the next day or two. While formal contracts between the Russian and Non-Russian groups will not be established until Monday the mere arrival of the first of the Soviet representatives had stirred up the phlegmatic atmosphere of the Hague.

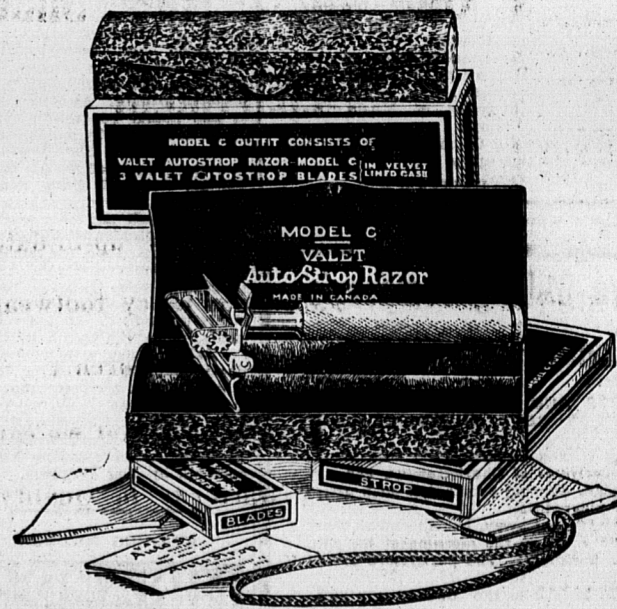
